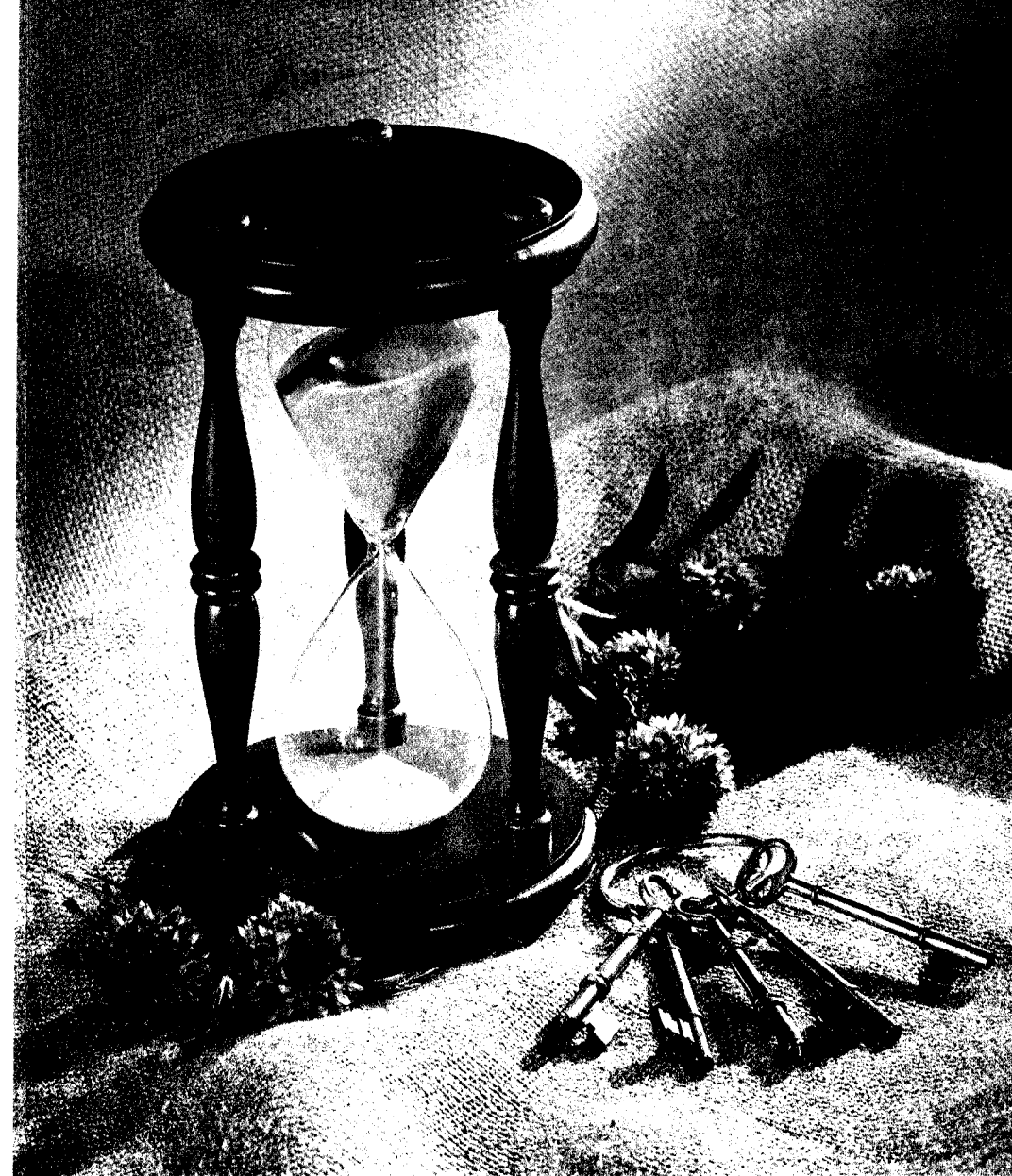

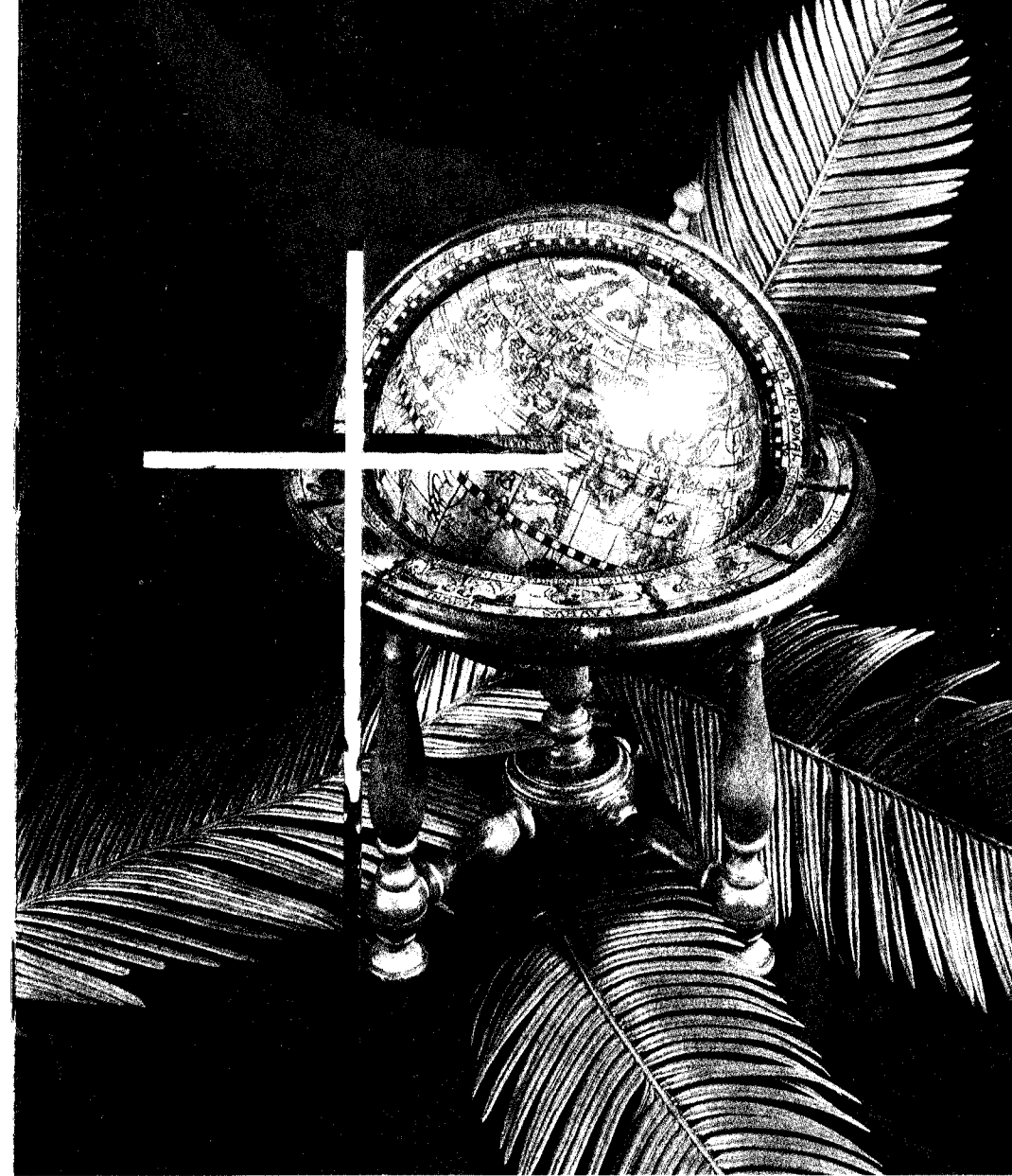

Why did Jesus have to suffer torture and experience what mortals call "death"? Because that was His mission. Mark tells us (10:45), "For even the Son of man came not to be ministered unto, but to minister, and to give His life a ransom for many."

Thus it was with Jesus. He came into a world filled with intolerance, and injustice; a world where men followed the "party line," and any who attempted to challenge the established order were obliged to recant or be put to death. He had a gift to offer more precious than earthly freedom --- the gift of eternal life.

Few could accept the gift. The ultimate in human agony would be required of Jesus. When it was all over, a few would know the glorious truth. They would "go into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature."

And since "The disciple is not above his master, nor the servant before his Lord, (Matt. 10:24) we too, must be ready to make sacrifices. There is no crown for those who will not share the burden of the cross.

The "burden of the cross" is not something we have but something we need. It is the brokenness needed for our human pride and self-sufficiency. It is the pouring out of God's forgiveness for our sinfilled thoughts, words, and deeds. It is our need to experience a broken and contrite human spirit, necessary to receive the fullness of God's love.

EXPLANATION OF THE SERVICE:

This service is patterned after the ancient office of Tenebrae. The word "Tenebrase" means darkness. The purpose of the service is to impress upon us the terrible reality of sin, which caused our Savior to die for us.

A total of eight candles are to be used in this worship service. Seven of these candles represent the seven last sentences which our Savior spoke from the Cross, and the eighth candle is the Christ Candle.

As the seven candles are extinguished one by one, causing the chancel to become increasingly darkened, we are reminded of the darkness that covered the earth at the time our Lord spoke these words at His crucifixion. It also serves as a reminder of the spiritual darkness that would exist had the Light of the world not come.

The exit of the Christ Candle, near the close of the service, signifies Christ's death and burial. When the book is lifted a few inches from the altar and slammed back down to create a definite closing sound, this acknowledges that with the sealed tomb the meaning of the cross is fulfilled, the sacrifice completed. The Christ Candle is not extinguished at any time during the service, as it is symbolic of the eternal light of God's love.

Though evil had it's hour, the light of God's love continues to burn to all eternity. Join us here on Easter morning and rejoice in the glorious message of the Risen Christ.

This Sunday brings to a conclusion his 44 years of service to St. John's Congregation.

Dr. Johann H. Eltermann was born in 1892 in West Baltimore. Music has always been a part of his life. He received his first musical instrument, an organ, when he was nine years old. Over the years he has also served at Walbrook Methodist, Chapel of the Redemption, Brown Memorial, Bethel Congregation and St. Mark's Lutheran. In 1937 he began his service with St. John's. While at St. John's he was given the honorary title "Doctor of Music" in 1958. During the years 1959 to 1961, he served at Emmanuel Episcopal Church. This Sunday brings to a conclusion his 44 years of service to St. John's Congregation.

We are grateful for the ministry of music Dr. Eltermann has performed in our midst over the years. He has brought an appreciation of classical organ music and a deep faith to our hearing. 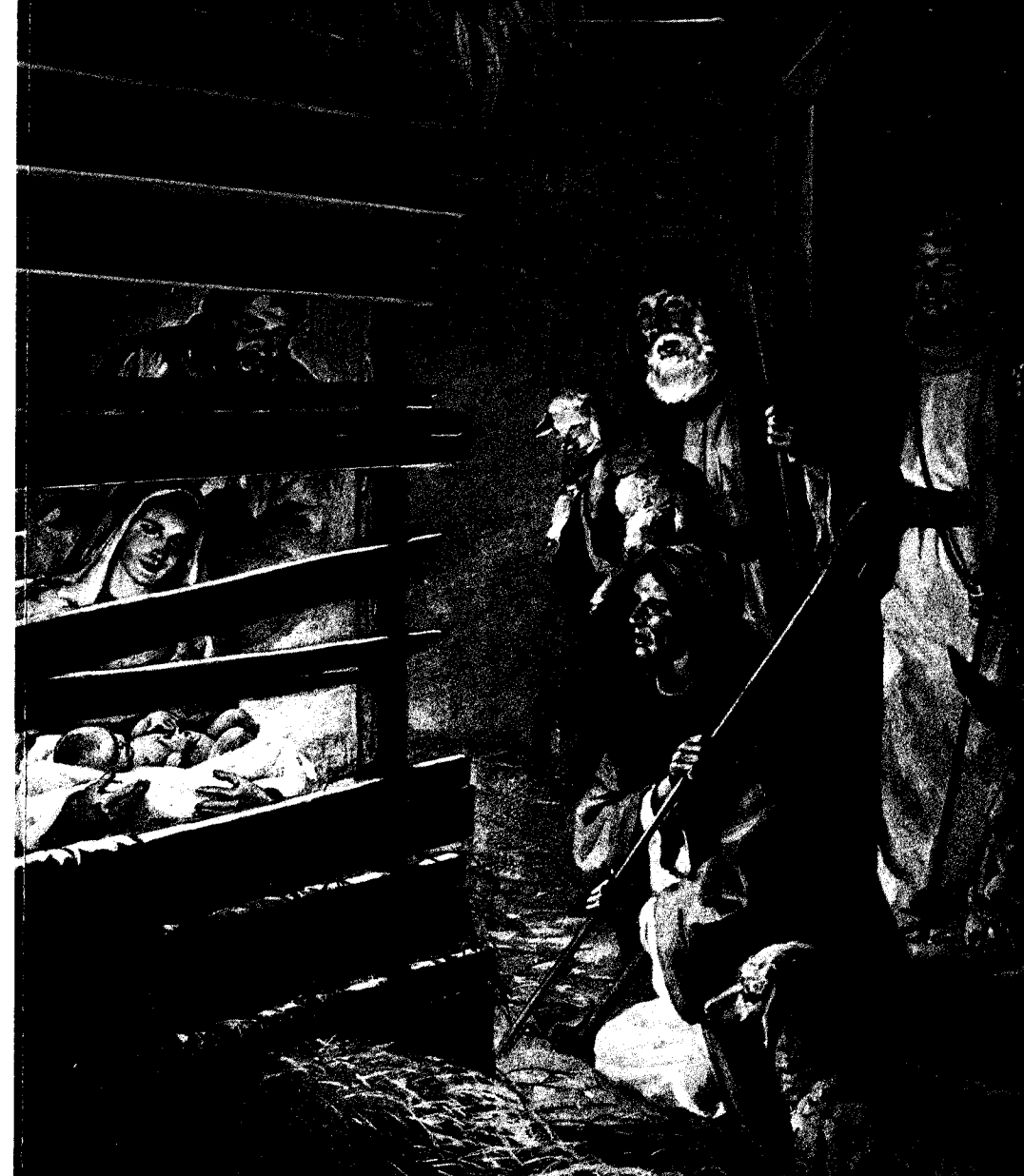
