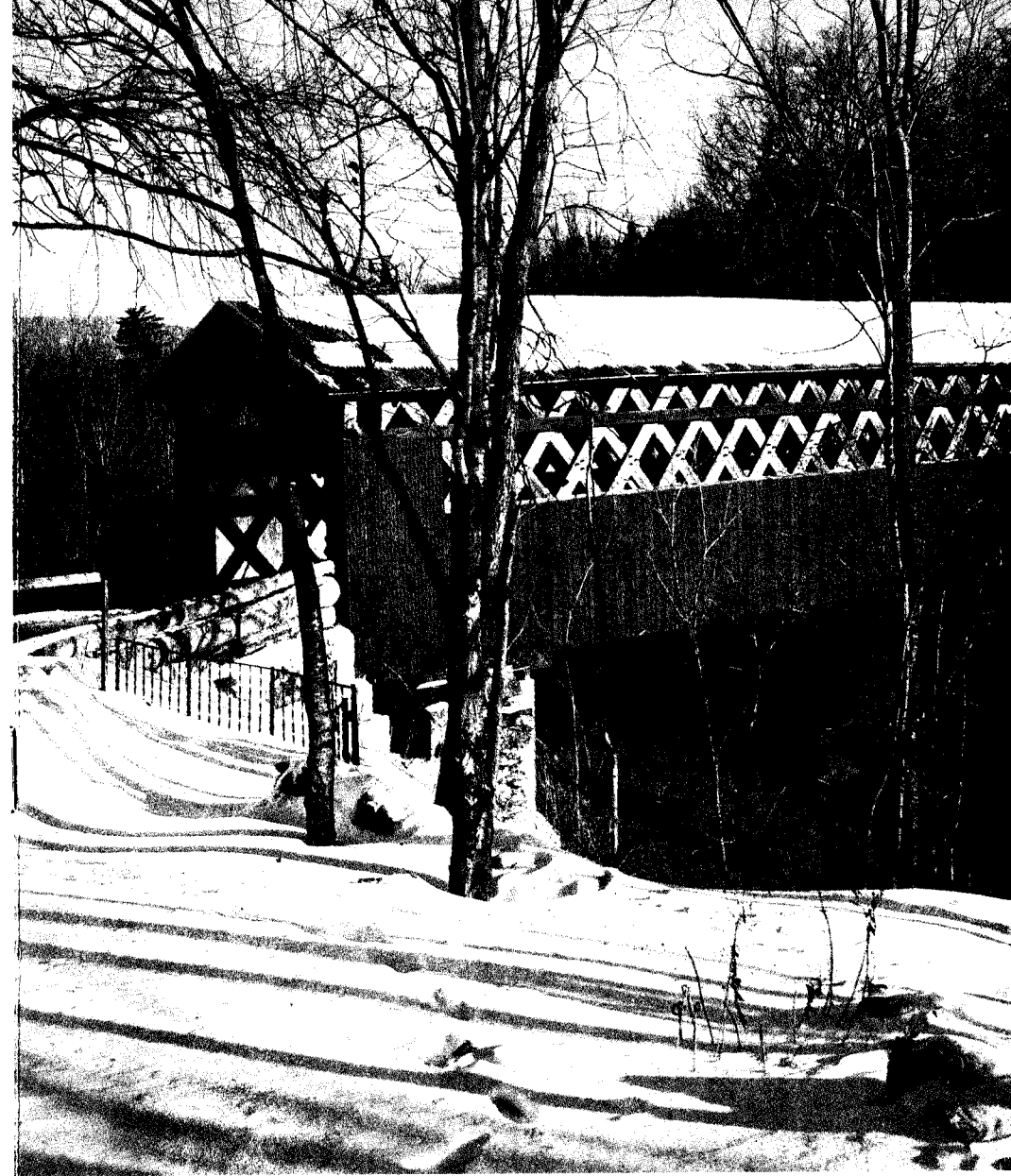

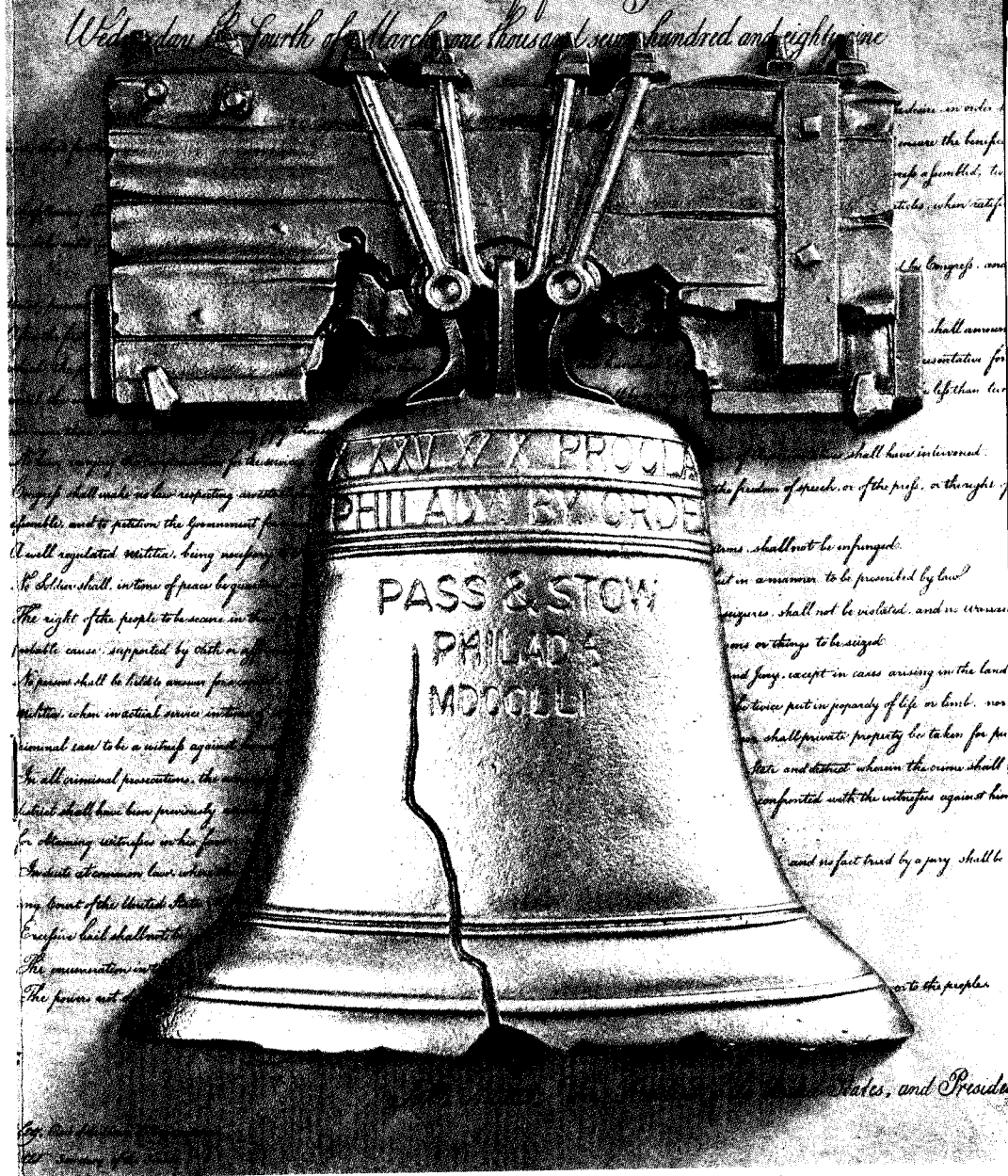

THE UNITED CHURCH OF CHRIST - A PROUD PEOPLE!

From the very beginning, we were a proud people--a people who have always put the proclaiming of the Good News of the Love of God before and above everything else! U.C.C. people are a pilgrim, pioneer, covenant family. We were the Separatist in the early 17th century England, the left-wing radicals of the Puritan movement, and the Pilgrims of the Mayflower and Plymouth Colony. We were the second group of Puritans who settled a few years later in the Massachusetts Bay Colony.

We were also the people of the Christian Church that was indigenous to America, with its beginnings after the Revolutionary War, made up of three like-minded groups, one from the South, one from New England, and one from the newly-opened Midwest. And we were the German Reformed settlers on the rich soil of Pennsylvania and Ohio, rooted deep in richer soil of

Christian history, of sound theology, and a solid doctrine of the church, warning against a purely subjective interpretation of the faith.

We were the Evangelical German Christians, beneficiaries of a Reformed and Lutheran union in Prussia and bringing to the Mississippi Valley where man settled a deep, genuine piety and warm cooperative Spirit. These are the names and places on this land, the deaths, the sacrifices we remember as a people, a special people, who celebrating their 27th year of union--the United Church Of Christ. Formed on June 25, 1957, we are one of the youngest denominations of American Churches, yet some of our congregations are among America's oldest...76% of our local congregations were organized before the year 1700 and some in New England date in the early 1600's, as the church in West Barnstable, Mass. founded in 1610.

Most of us generally use some form of the English language. Yet some of our members are more at home with Spanish, some German or Hungarian. Some are heirs of the Pilgrim parents whose faith was founded on the faith of the English Reformers, while others were influenced by John Calvin, Martin Luther, Zwingli, and the German reformers. We are located in every state, but very unevenly, with Pennsylvania having more of us than any other state. 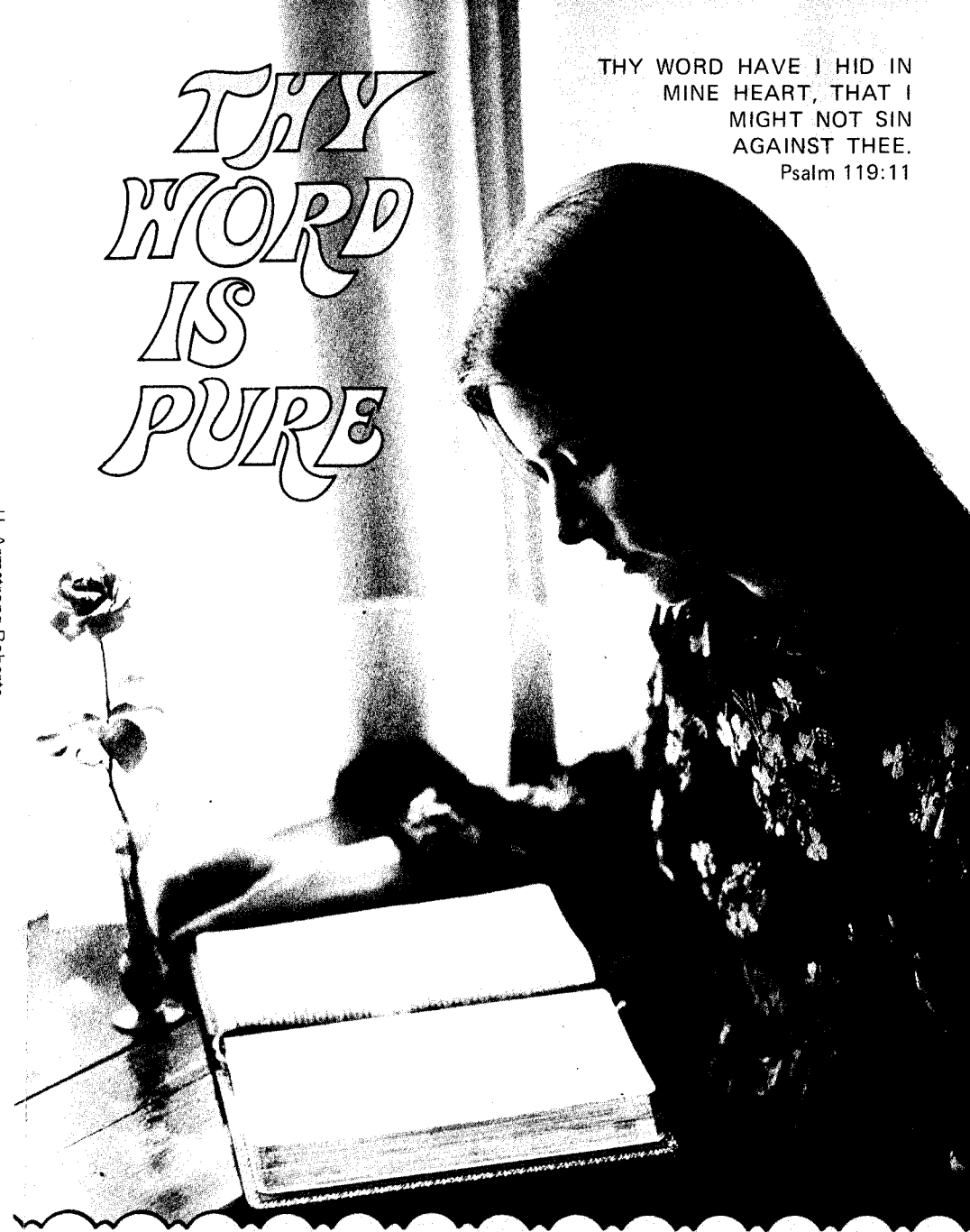

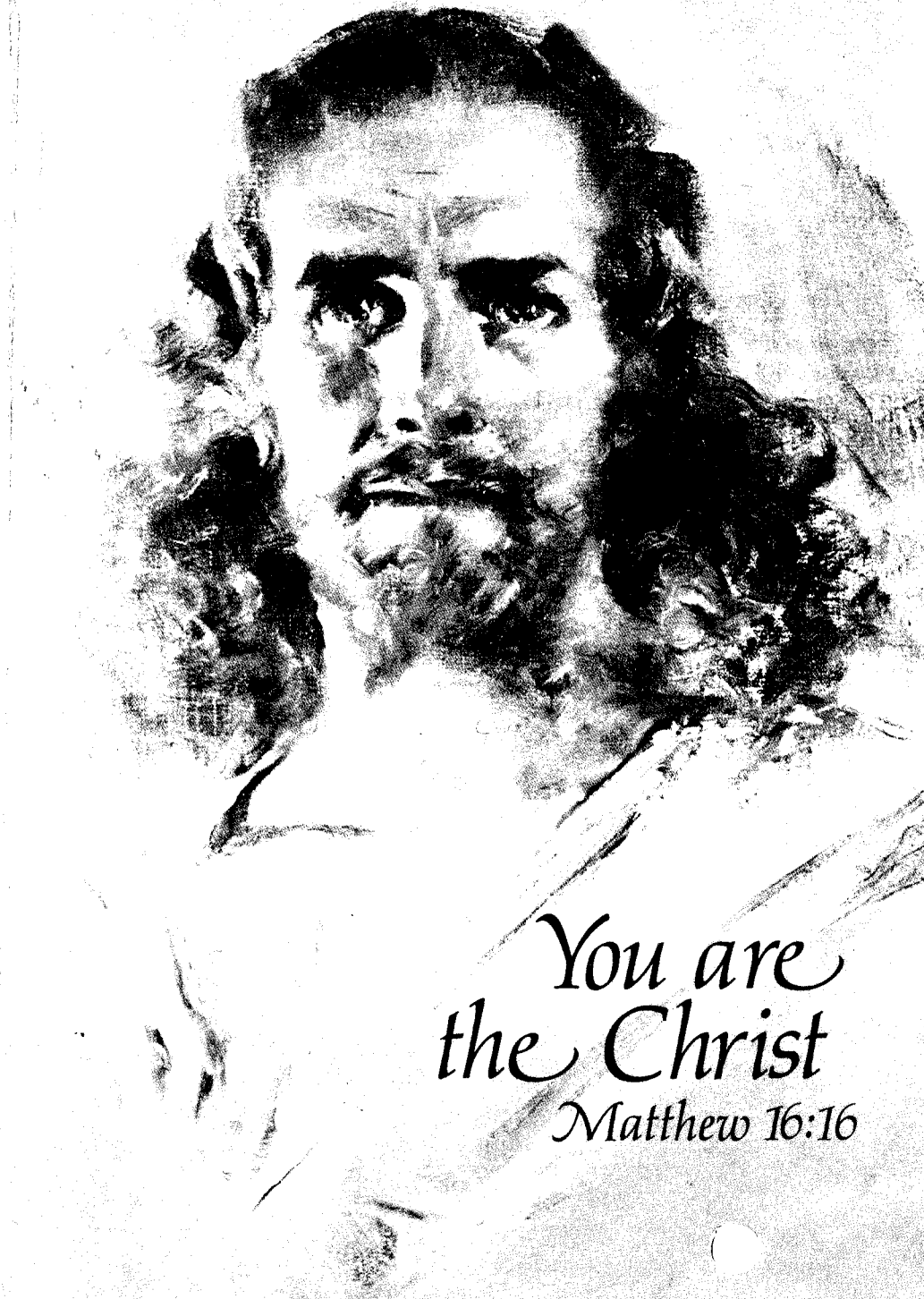

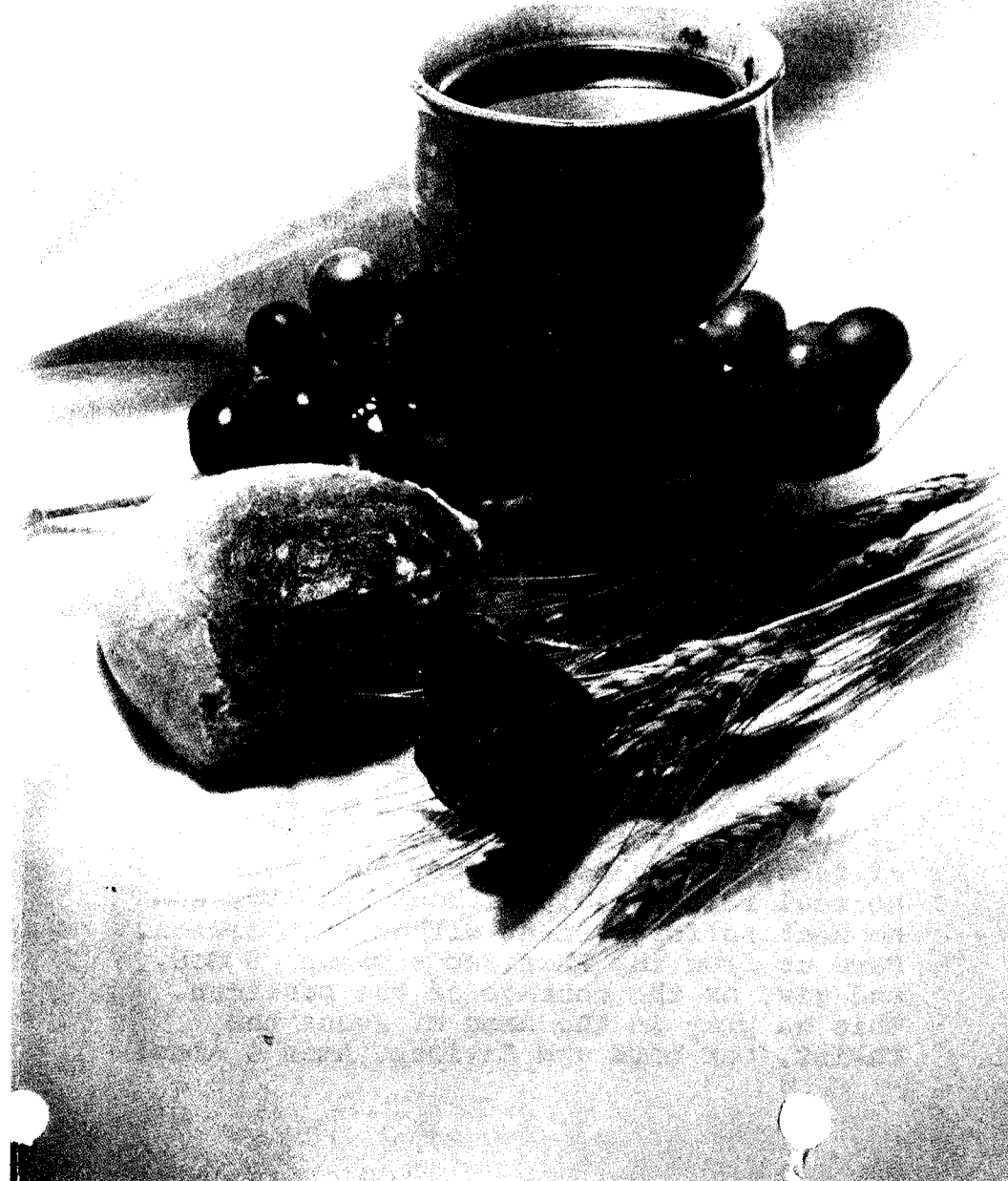

THE CROSS AND THE CROWN

Why did Jesus have to suffer torture and experience what mortals call death? Because that was His mission. Mark tells us (10:45), "For even the Son of man came not to be ministered unto, but to minister, and to give His life a ransom for many."

Thus it was with Jesus. He came into a world filled with intolerance, and injustice; a world where men followed the "party line," and any who attempted to challenge the established order were obliged to recant or be put to death. He had a gift to offer more precious than earthly freedom --- the gift of eternal life.

Few could accept the gift. The ultimate in human agony would be required of Jesus. When it was all over, a few would know the glorious truth. They would "go into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature."

And, since "The disciple is not above his master, nor the servant before his Lord" (Matt. 10:24) we too, must be ready to make sacrifices. There is no crown for those who will not share the burden of the cross.

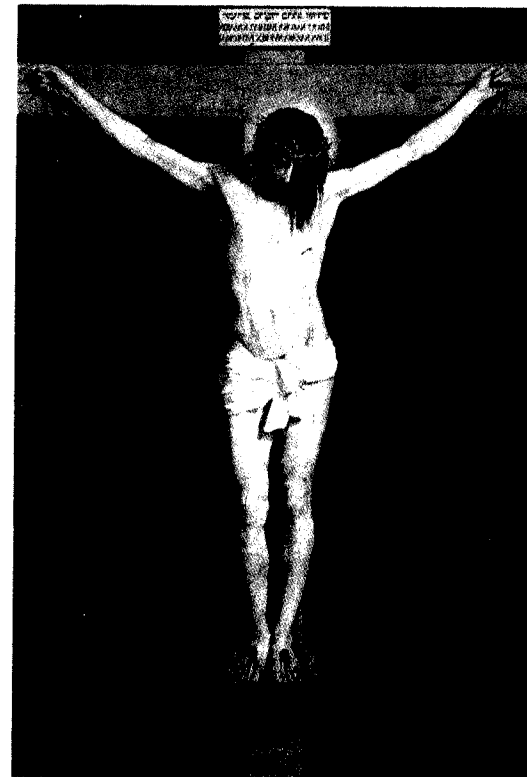
The "burden of the cross" is not something we have but something we need. It is the brokenness needed for our human pride and self-sufficiency. It is the pouring out of God's forgiveness for our sinfilled thoughts, words, and deeds. It is our need to experience a broken and contrite human spirit, necessary to receive the fullness of God's love.

PRAYER: Dear God, may we come to rely fully on the truth of the gospel and Realize You.

may be by a majority vote of those vot-
ing at a Congregational Meeting.
6. In the event of the Pastor's leaving his
position, United Evangelical Church shall
not be responsible for moving his posses-

sions from the parsonage.

7. The Pastor's annual salary shall be \$12,500.00 per year payable in 24 equal installments on the 1st and 15th of each month.
8. The Pastor shall receive a car allowance of 20¢ per mile plus parking and tolls, for church business, payable on the 1st of each month.
9. 14% of the Pastor's annual salary shall be paid to the Pension Fund of the United Church Of Christ. This 14% shall be in addition to and not deducted from the annual salary.
10. Social Security, if any, is to be paid by the Pastor.
11. Hospitalization, Health and Accident Insurance for the Pastor and his wife/family is to be provided and paid for by United Evangelical Church in amounts mutually agreed upon.
12. The Pastor is to have annually, a total of four weeks paid vacation. The time (or times) of this vacation shall be established each year by agreement between the Pastor and the Church Council. Effort shall be made to establish the time (or times) of this vacation as early in each calendar year as is practicable.
13. The Pastor shall arrange with the approval of the Church Council, for a replacement Pastor (or Pastors) to take his place when he is absent. The vacation replacement is to be paid by United Evangelical Church.
14. The Pastor and his family shall live in the parsonage rent free. Heat and all utilities shall be paid by United Evan-

gelical Church. Telephone services is to be paid by United Evangelical Church except for personal toll calls. Maintenance shall be paid by United Evangelical Church. Air conditioning units shall be provided in the parsonage. Refrigerator, freezer, dishwasher, garbage disposal, cooking stove, clothes washer and dryer shall be provided and maintained by United Evangelical Church. Choice of fuel for cooking, heating and hot water shall be made by the Church Council.

15. For purposes of inspection and maintenance the Church shall (after reasonable notice to the Pastor) have access to the parsonage during reasonable daylight hours. Except for the above, or in event of any emergency, no person may enter the parsonage without the consent or invitation of the Pastor and/or his wife. A duplicate set of parsonage keys shall be kept in a sealed envelope in the Church safe from which they may not be removed except by resolution of the Church Council. No locks on the parsonage may be changed without the consent of the Church Council.
17. At budget-making time each year the Pastor's remunerations are to be reviewed.

PASTOR'S DUTIES:

- A. Pastor shall abide by all the provisions of the Constitution and By-Laws of United Evangelical Church.
- B. Pastor shall adhere to all schedules of fees set by the Church Council.
- C. Pastor shall turn over to the congregation all cash honorariums received by him.
- D. Pastor shall, unless prevented by illness or vacation, attend every regular and

special meetings of the Church Council and the Congregation.

- E. Pastor is an ex-officio member of each committee and his interest and participation in their activities is desired and welcomed.
- F. Pastor shall, at each monthly meeting, submit a written report to the Council of his activities during the proceeding month --including the number of miles driven in his car on church business. He shall also make recommendations to the Council for any action deemed by him to be desirable for the ongoing welfare of United Evangelical Church.
- G. Pastor shall conduct all regular and special services of United Evangelical Church. Communion shall be offered at all Church services which he and the Church Council deem desirable. Communion shall be offered on the first Sunday of each month unless he and the Church Council change this arrangement for some special reason.
- H. Pastor shall adhere to the Doctrines and regulations of the United Church of Christ. He shall be a Clergyman in good standing with that denomination.
- I. Pastor shall visit the sick in hospitals and home as soon as possible.
- J. Pastor shall visit the shut-ins as often as practicable. Effort shall be made to offer communion to the shut-ins at Easter and Christmas as close to the date of the event as possible.
- K. Pastor shall instruct the Confirmation Class. It shall be his decision in consultation, subject to the approval of the Church Council, as to the readiness of a

candidate for Confirmation. Confirmation shall be on Palm Sunday unless change is approved by the Church Council.

- L. Pastor shall conduct all weddings, funerals and baptisms. Pastor and Council shall exert the strongest efforts to work together to establish a clear and widely understood policy on these and all other matters affecting United Evangelical Church to the end that we may spread the Word of Jesus Christ.
