This year we of the United family will follow an ancient practice that is being used by more congregations each year.

Palm branches saved from the celebration of Palm Sunday last year will be burned on Shrove

Tuesday. As part of the Ash Wednesday liturgy ashes will be imposed for those members desiring them.

Ash Wednesday is named for the practice of imposing ashes. The ancient symbol has validity in several aspects of our modern life. First, ashes remind us of God's condemnation of sin (Genesis 3:19). Second, in ancient times ashes were used in the absence of soap. Ash Wednesday the ashes are a penitential substitute for water as a reminder of our Baptism. Water both drowns and refreshes, ashes are a symbol of both death and renewal. Third, ashes remind us of the shortness of human life. The imposition of the ashes reminds us of the words of the burial service "We commit his/her body to the ground; earth to earth, ashes to ashes, dust to dust." These words will one day be spoken over each of us. Fourth and finally, ashes are a symbol of repentance. They are the outward sign of the inner penitence.

If you so desire, please bring your palms to church on Sunday, February 10 to be burned.

Much prayerful consideration, by your pastor and Church Council has gone into the decision to reintroduce this practice into our Christian community. We are hopeful it will further enrich our spiritual life together at United.

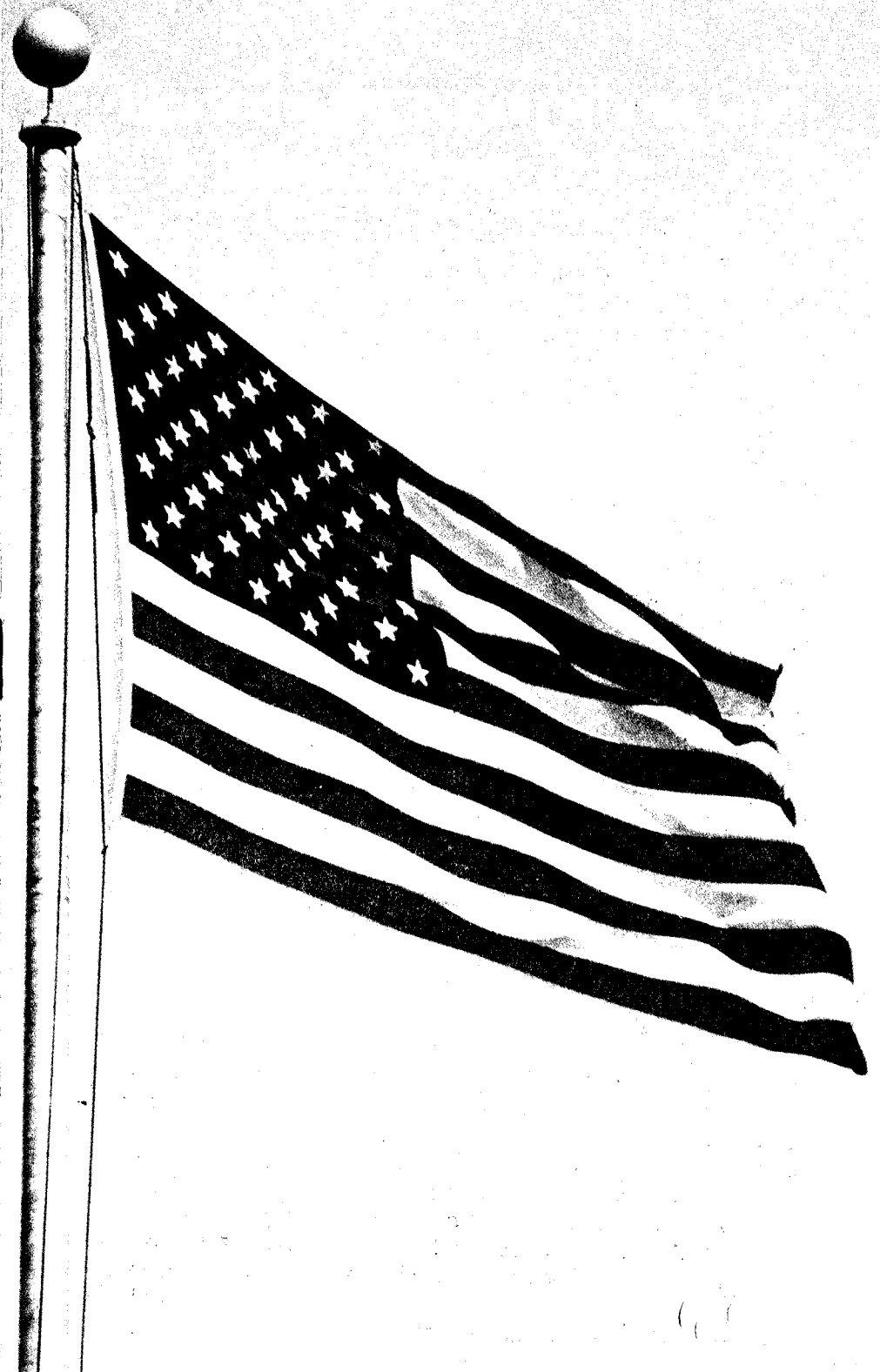

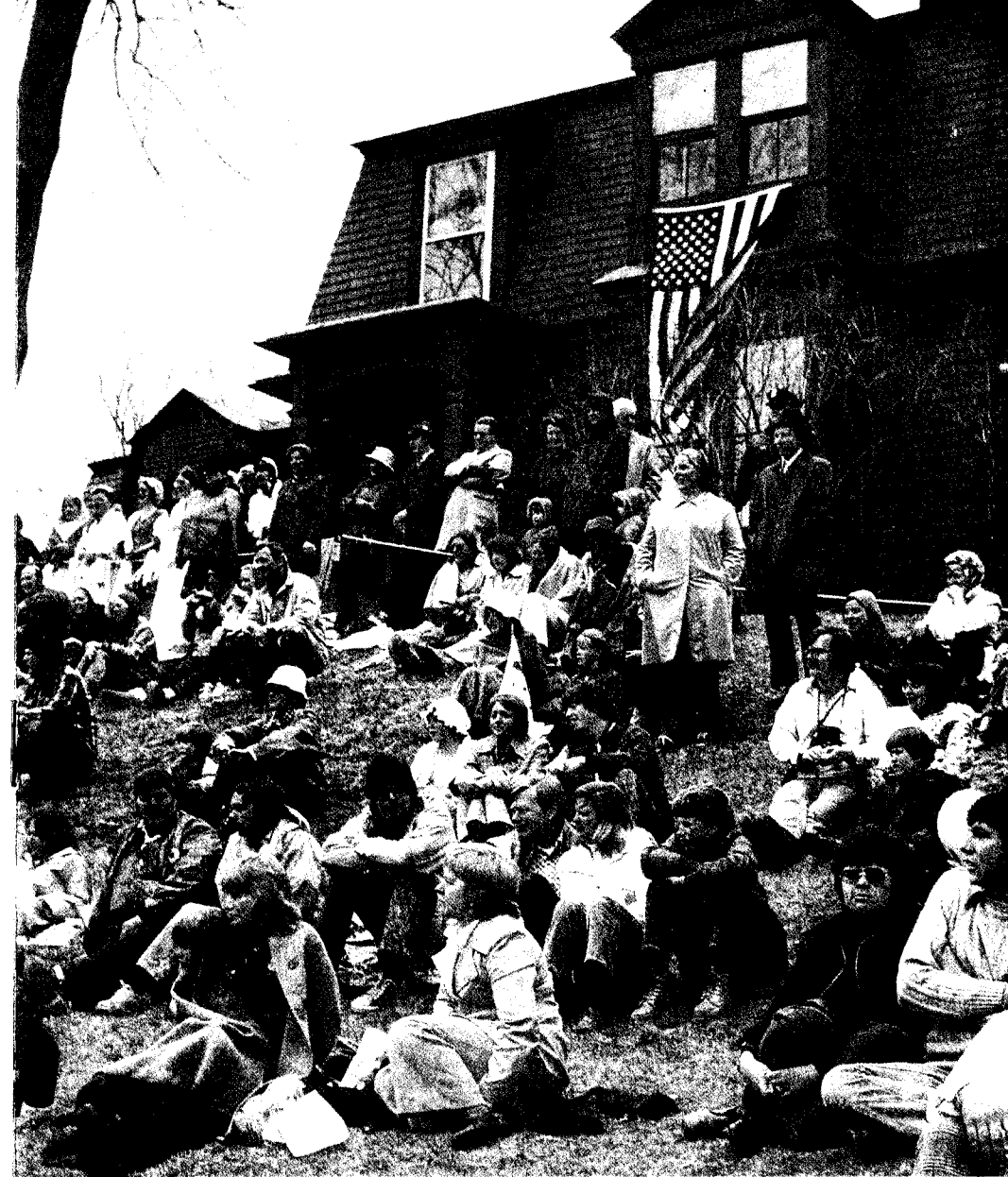

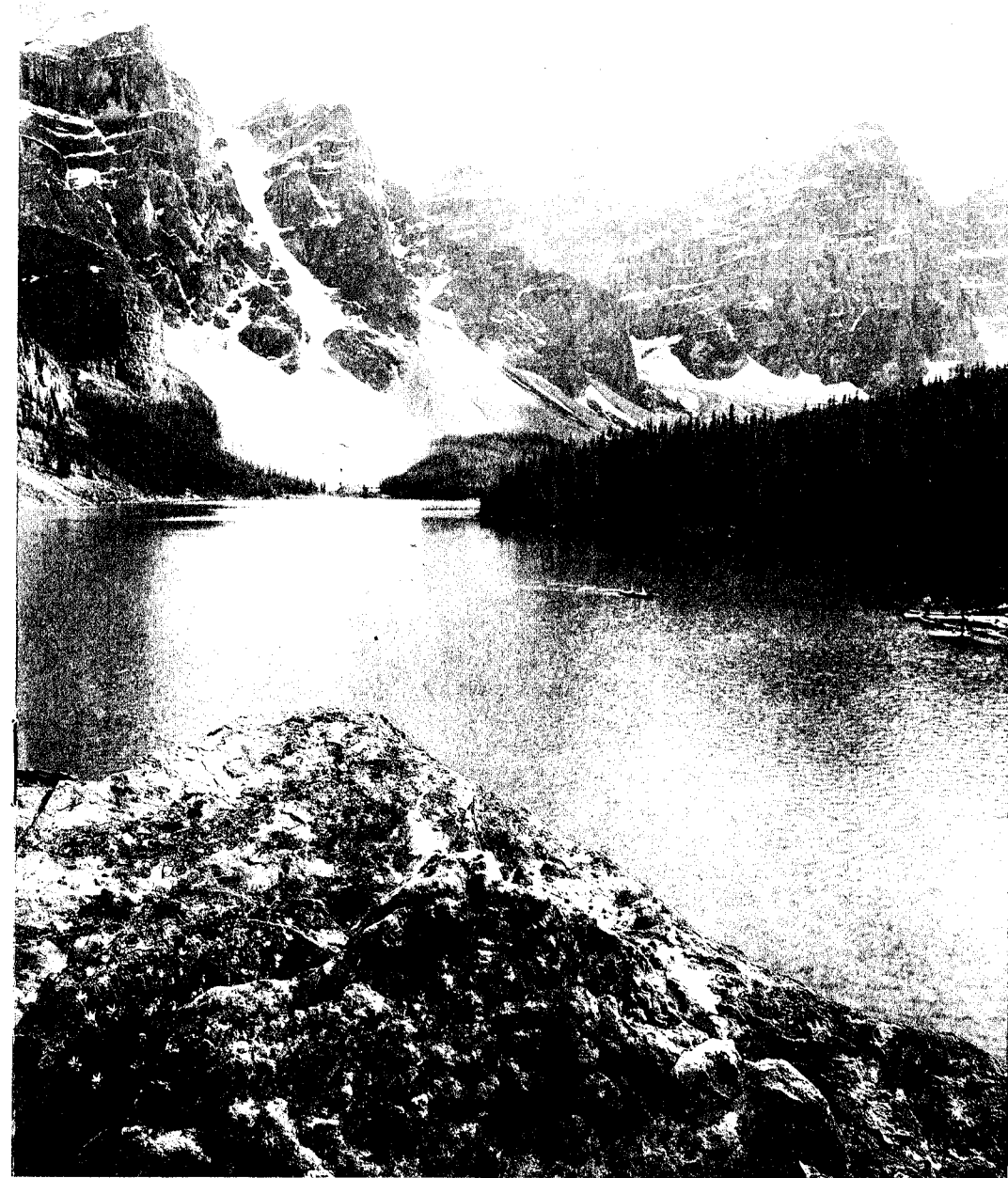

Salvatore Dali's *The Sacrament of the Last Supper* is perhaps the most popular painting in the National Gallery of Art collection. Salvatore Dali is the most famous of the contemporary surrealist painters. The Christian subject matter, the simplicity of organization, and the lack of shock value separate *The Sacrament of the Last Supper* from almost all of Dali's other works. This tableau of 1955 is religious and accurately portrays the view from Dali's home on the Catalan coast of northeastern Spain.

As in the harmonious presentation of Renaissance schemes, the composition here is clearly defined into two main planes: foreground action and background scenery. The placement of men around the table is symmetrical, the figures being repeated in perfect mirror-images on both sides of Christ. Moreover, the entire nine-foot-long picture is constructed according to complex mathematical ratios devised by Renaissance scientists and such ancient Greek philosophers as Pythagoras. The men at the table, rather than being specific apostles, are idealized participants. The bread and wine on the table represent the physical presence of Christ, while his apparently transparent figure at the table may represent Christ's presence as Holy Spirit. The whole Trinity is represented if the arms outstretched overhead are those of God the Father.

There have been other interpretations of the symbolism of this painting. Perhaps because many interpretations of its symbolism are possible, *The Sacrament of the Last Supper* suggests that liturgy is as much a matter of religious imagination as of verbal formulas and ritual actions.
