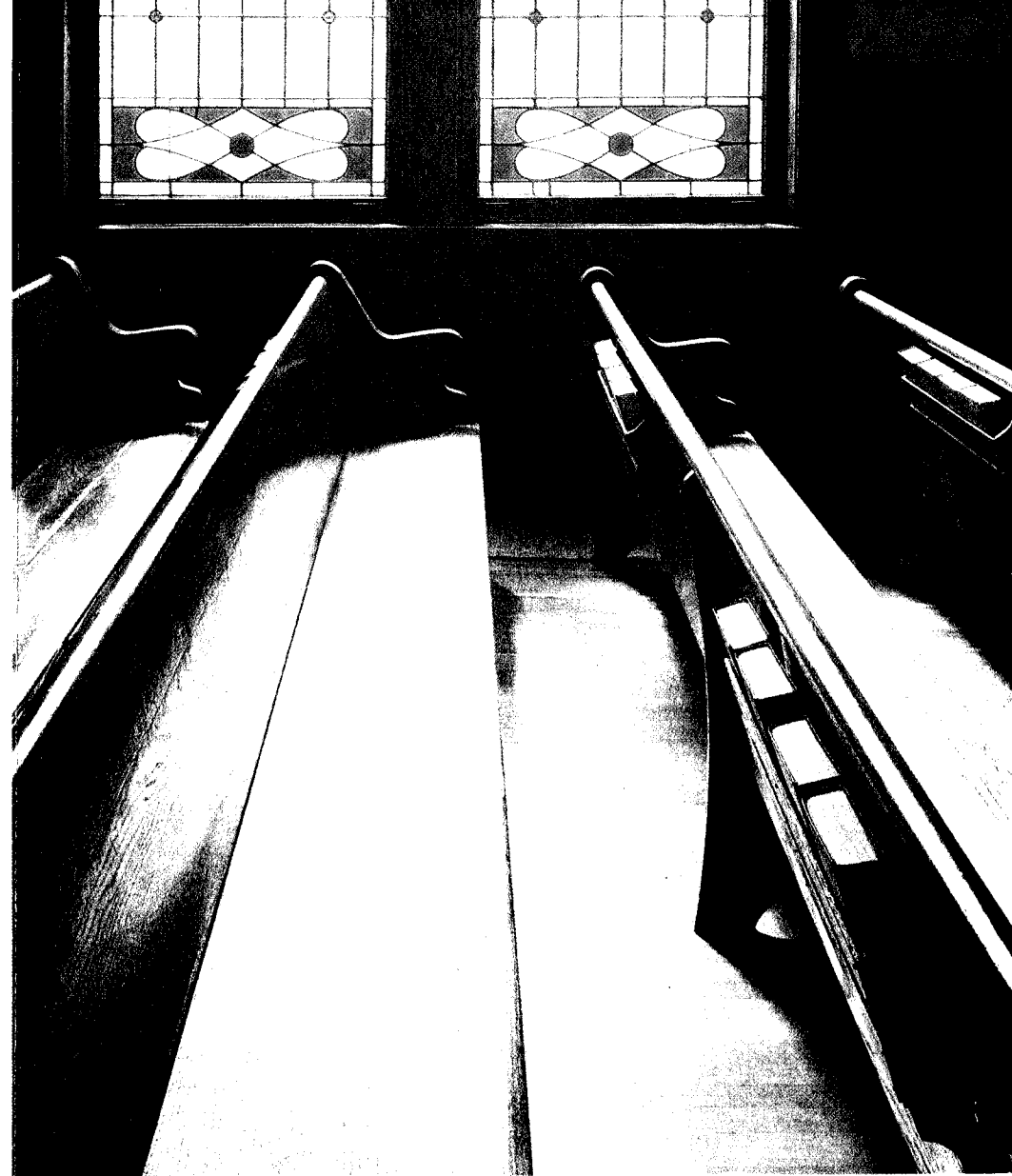

Ash Wednesday is named for the practice of imposing ashes. The ancient symbol has validity in several aspects of our modern life. First, ashes remind us of God's condemnation of sin (Genesis 3:19). Second, in ancient times ashes were used in the absence of soap. Ash Wednesday the ashes are a penitential substitute for water as a reminder of our Baptism. Water both drowns and refreshes, ashes are a symbol of both death and renewal. Third, ashes remind us of the shortness of human life. The imposition of the ashes reminds us of the words of the burial service "We commit his/her body to the ground; earth to earth, ashes to ashes, dust to dust." These words will one day be spoken over each of us. Fourth and finally, ashes are a symbol of repentance. They are the outward sign of the inner penitence.

Water both drowns and refreshes, ashes are a symbol of both death and renewal. Third, ashes remind us of the shortness of human life. The imposition of the ashes reminds us of the words of the burial service "We commit his/her body to the ground; earth to earth, ashes to ashes, dust to dust." Second, in ancient times ashes were used in the absence of soap. Ash Wednesday the ashes are a penitential substitution for water as a reminder of our Baptism. Water both drowns and refreshes, ashes are a symbol of both death and renewal. Third, ashes remind us of the shortness of human life. The imposition of the ashes reminds us of the words of the burial service "We commit his/her body to the ground; earth to earth, ashes to ashes, dust to dust." These words will one

day be spoken over each of us. Fourth and finally, ashes are a symbol of repentance. They are the outward sign of the inner penitence.

13. You will never have to decide about attending Church again.
