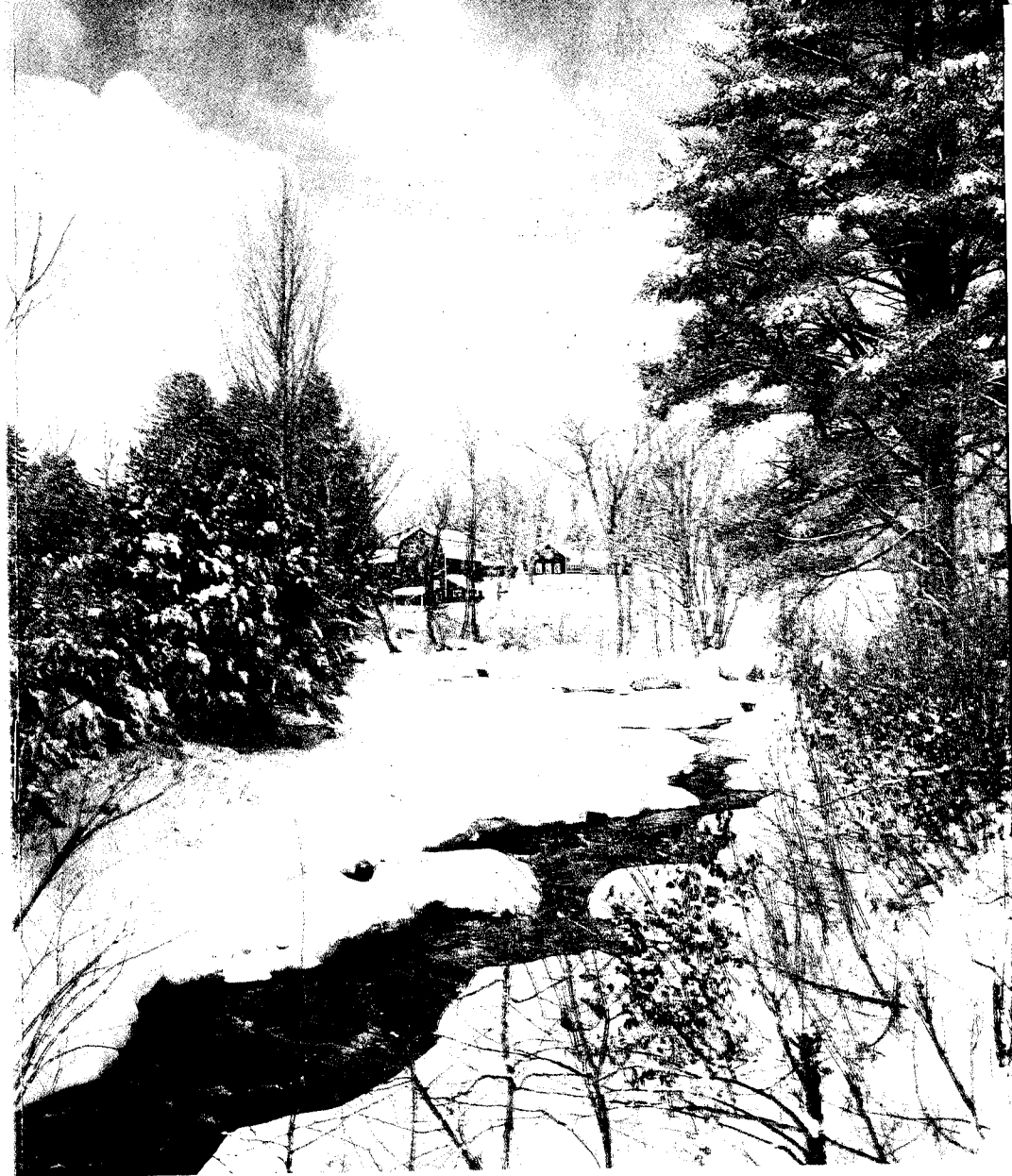

The imposition of the ashes reminds us of the words of the burial service "We commit his/her body to the ground; earth to earth, ashes to ashes, dust to dust." These words will one day be spoken over each of us. Fourth and finally, ashes are a symbol of repentance. They are the outward sign of the inner penitence.

On Ash Wednesday, we will have ashes imposed during the Worship Service. If you so desire,

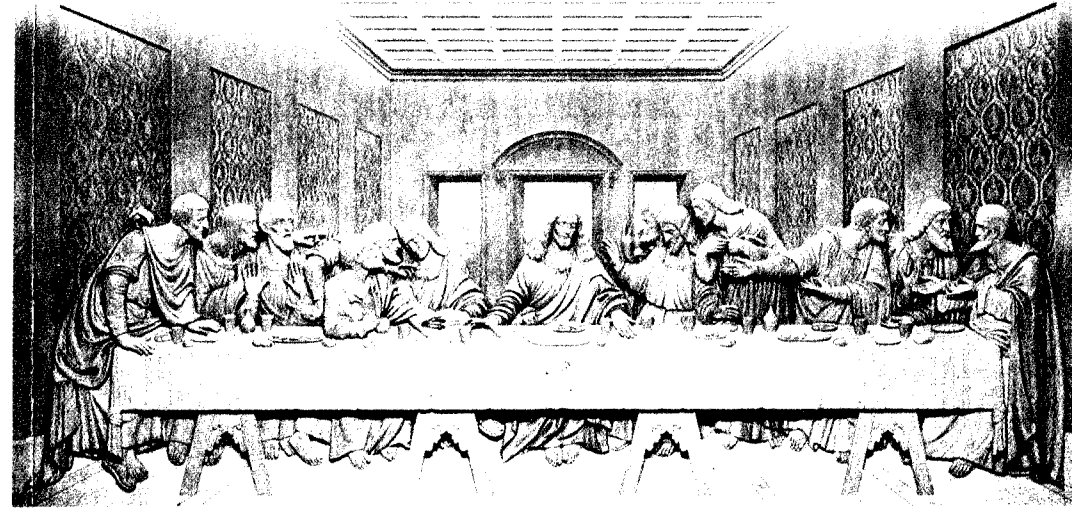

Today we welcome you to this service of praise and thanksgiving for the life of Johann H. Eltermann. He was born July 25, 1892 here in Baltimore of German parents. He sang in public for the first time at the age of 3. Illness nearly took his life in childhood. He missed one year of school. To encourage him in making up that work, his father promised him an organ. Johann not only made up for lost time, but became number one in his class. At Christmas time the organ was given and the outstanding musical career of Johann Eltermann began in earnest. He studied under many teachers, including faculty members of the Peabody Institute.

For many years he was employed by the Hamman Music Company, was theater organist at the Valencia Theater, played at the Ecumenical Sunrise Service at Memorial Stadium, played the organ and directed the combined choirs for city-wide Reformation Services, has received citations for his contributions to German culture and music from mayors and governors, taught countless students in vocal, piano and organ music. He has directed many choirs, among them the Deutscher Damenchor, the Arion Maennerchor, the United Singers of Baltimore, and the Washington Saengerbund. He has served as organist at Brown Memorial Church, First English Lutheran Church, and St. John's United Church of Christ. St. John's recognized his musical contribution by conferring the honorary title of "Doctor" upon Mr. Eltermann in the mid 1950's.

The memory of John Eltermann lives on in the scholarship fund at U.M.B.C.
