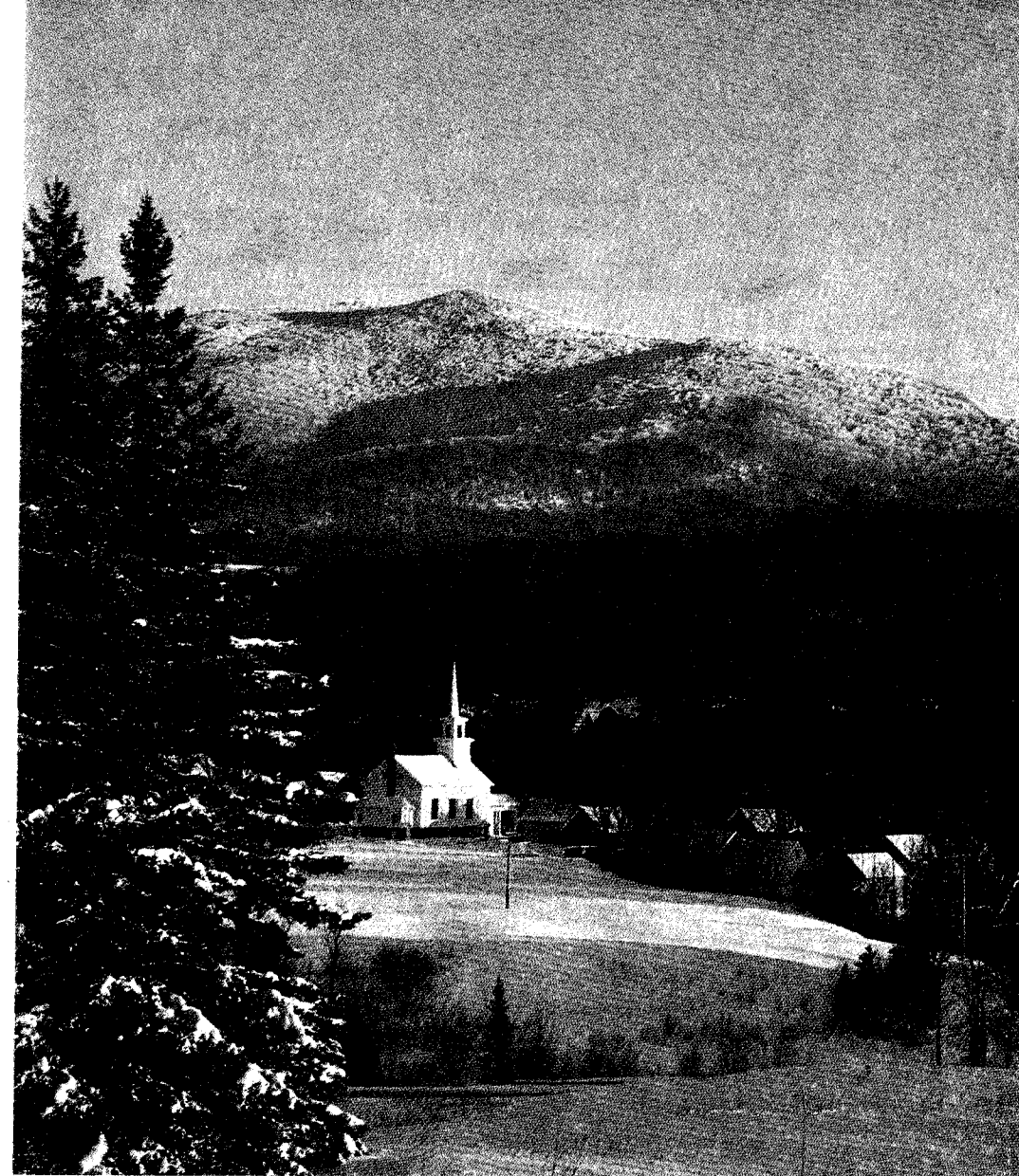

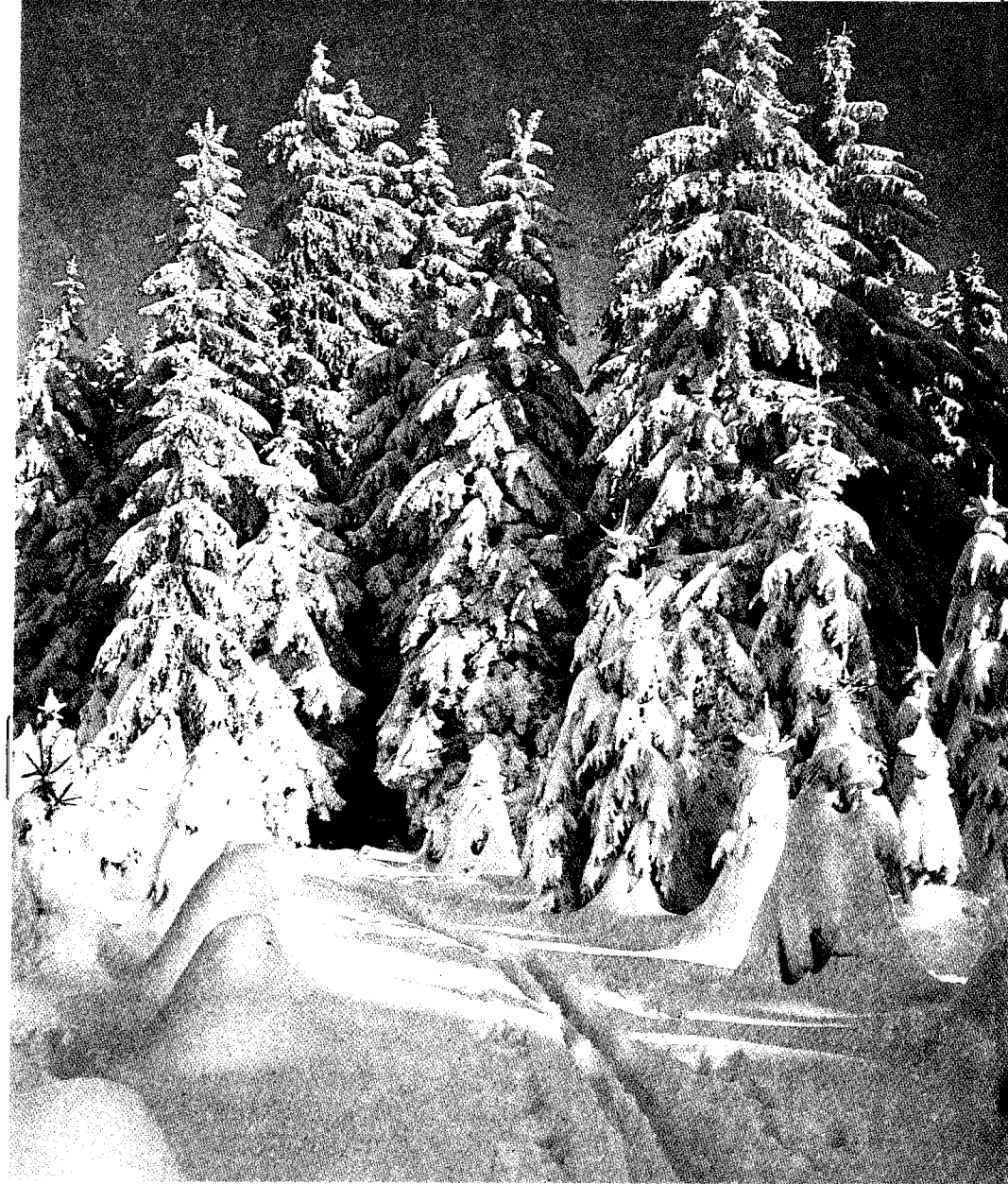

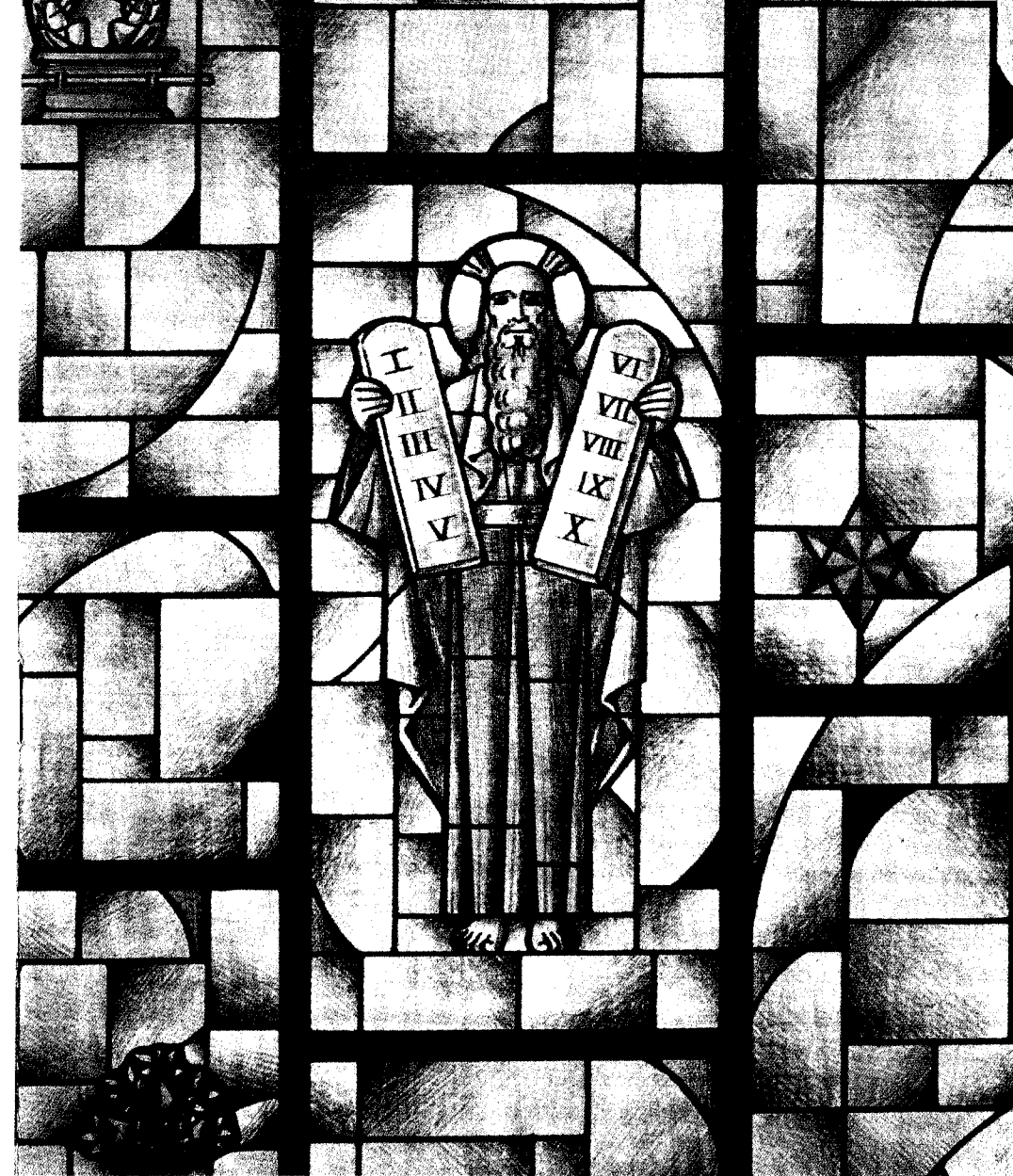

Lenten Worship services begin on Wednesday, February 28 at 7:30 p.m. Ash Wednesday is named for the practice of imposing ashes. The ancient symbol has validity in several aspects of our modern life. First, ashes remind us of God's condemnation of sin (Genesis 3:19). Second, in ancient times ashes were used in the absence of soap. Ash Wednesday the ashes are a penitential substitute for water as a reminder of our Baptism. Water both drowns and refreshes, ashes are a symbol of both death and renewal. Third, ashes remind us of the shortness of human life. The imposition of the ashes, reminds us of the words of the burial service, "We commit his/her body to the ground; earth to earth, ashes to ashes, dust to dust". These words will one day be spoken over each of us. Fourth and finally, ashes are a symbol of repentance. They are the outward sign of the inner penitence. This year, we of the UNITED EVANGELICAL CHURCH FAMILY will follow an ancient practice that is being used by more congregations each year. 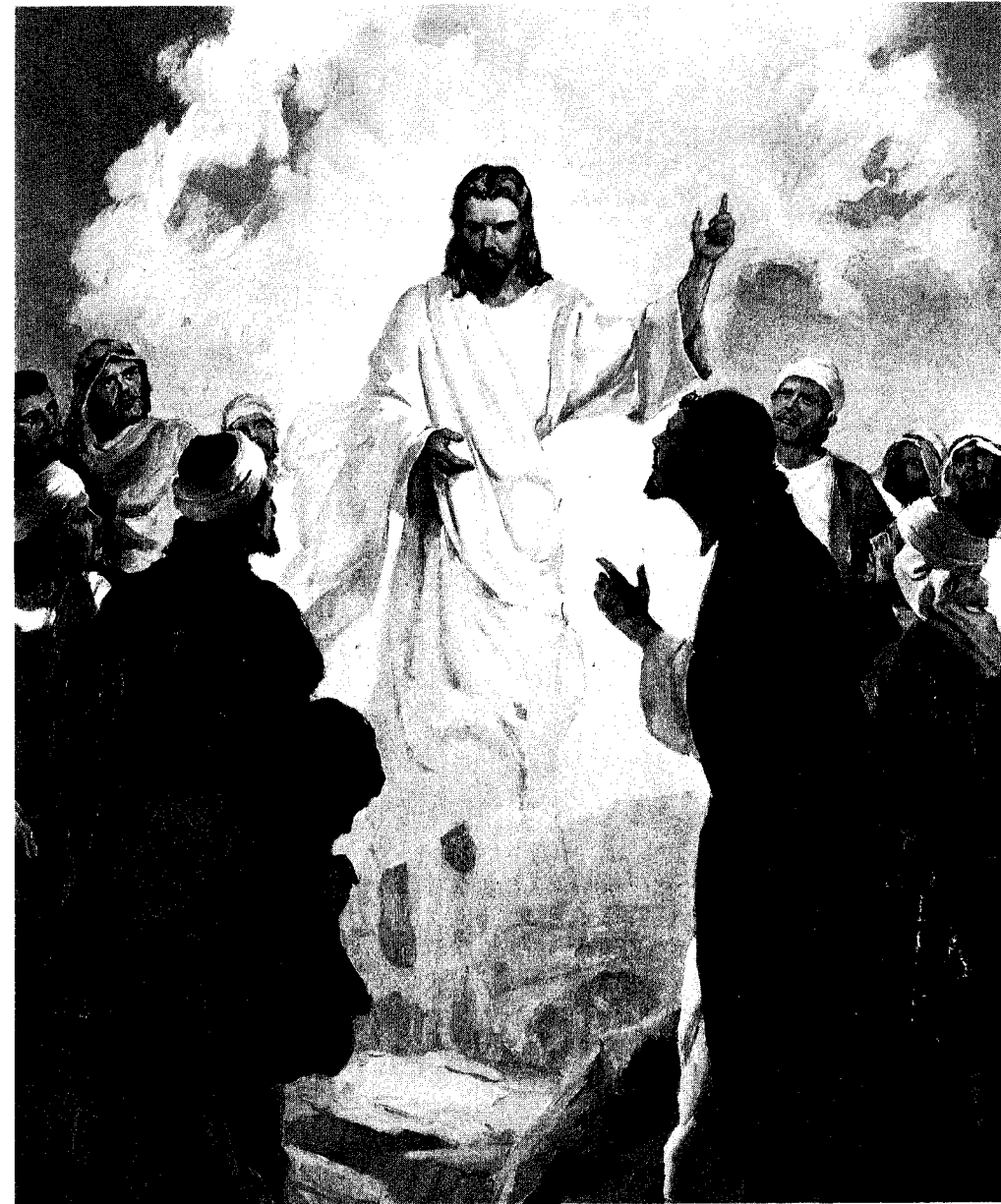
Last Sunday I was honored to have been elected as your Pastor and to have the opportunity to share with you in leading a great historic church which has served Canton and Baltimore since 1873.

AN 'OPEN' LETTER FROM THE PASTOR'S WIFE:

August, 1990

When you elected Bob as your Pastor, you also got a "Pastor's Wife" about whom you know almost nothing. I thought you might like to know a little about who I am beside's Bob's wife. He told you about my Grandfather who was a Congregational Minister. My father was a Methodist Episcopal (now United Methodist) minister for over 50 years, until his death in 1985. My mother was a Congregational Lay Preacher. She is very ill in a nursing home in Vermont. My two brothers are ordained United Methodist ministers, one still actively serving a parish.
