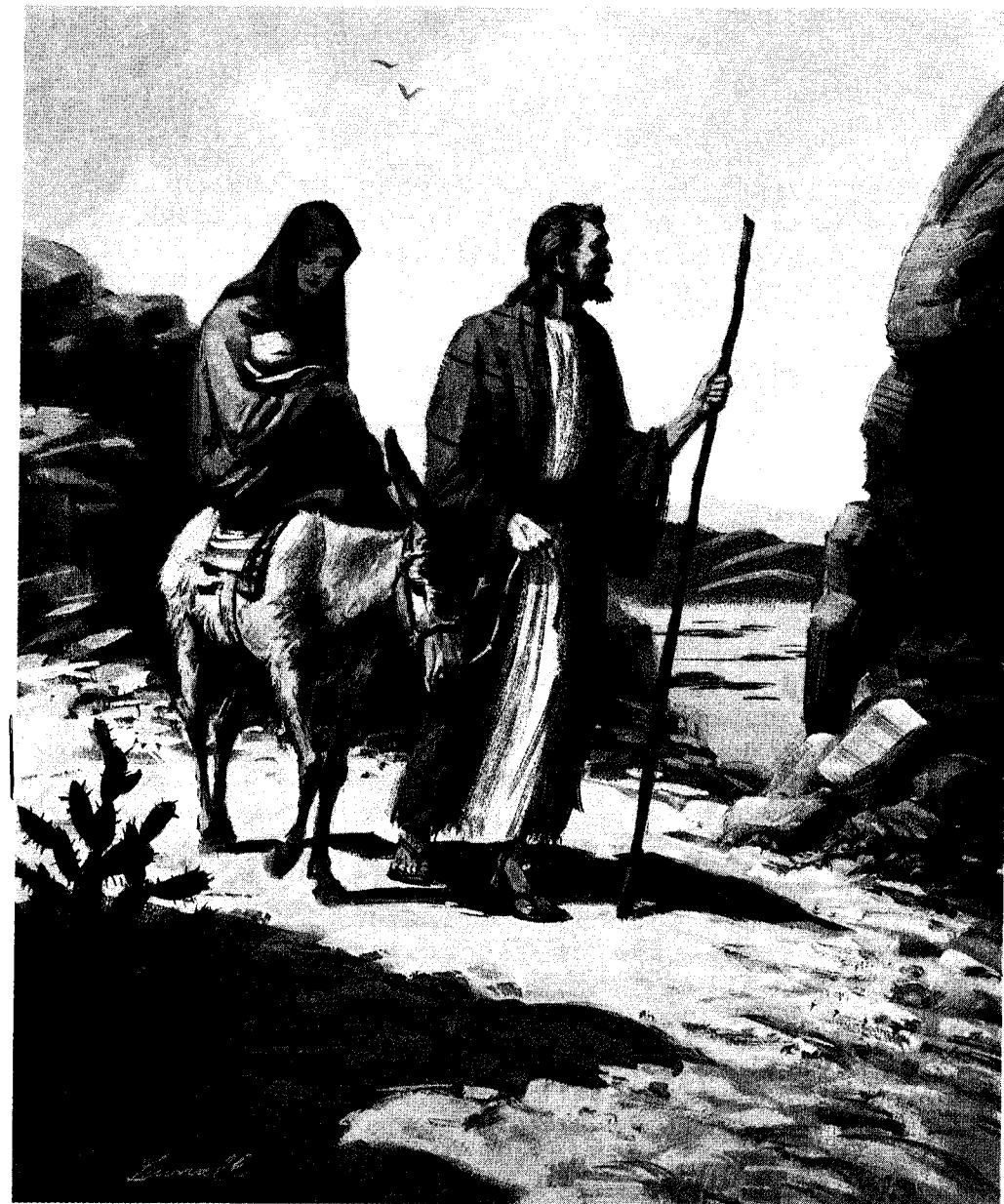

THE NEW REVISED STANDARD VERSION OF THE BIBLE:

For decades before 1611, many English translations of the Bible were made--Coverdale's, the Bishops' Bible, the Great Bible, Rheims-Douay, but when the King James Version appeared, it swept all others before it, truly "the noblest monument of English prose."

Since the 1880s, modern scholarly research and familiar changing language have led to many new translations. Now at last a version has appeared which is likely to become as close to an "authorized" translation as the state of the Christian churches will allow. The New Revised Standard Version is superior to all others, including its direct source, the RSV which has been the one most used since 1953. NRSV is clearer, especially for reading aloud, it is more accurate, gives new discoveries in Biblical manuscripts, and it is more universal in style, no longer using "man" or "mankind" as generic nouns for "person" or "humankind." We will use the NRSV in most of our public readings, in church and in our classes.

We thank all of you who took time to come down to the Church to have your picture taken for the Church Directory and for coming back to approve the pictures. When the books are completed, you will be advised. The book will be a valuable "asset" in your home, putting "names" to "faces" you have met so often in Church. This moving hymn testifies to the great change God can bring to an individual's life. It was written by John Newton in 1779 and is based on his own transformation "by the rich mercy of our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ," as he says in his self-written epitaph. Once a slave-ship captain, he was later ordained into the Church of England and wrote over two hundred fifty hymns.

REPORT OF THE FINANCE COMMITTEE:

Your Council Finance Committee will be re-
porting to you monthly on the state of the
church. While our church membership has
grown and we have increased attendance by
15% for the months from January to May and
by 23% in the month of June, and while we
have raised more money than ever before, in
special events such as the Sour Beef Dinner,
we are currently \$15,564.54 behind in meet-
ing monthly expenses. This is partly due to
some unforeseen expenses such as the elec-
tric dimmers necessary for safe operation
of the church, to a new air conditioner for
the office (our old one burned out after 16
years use) and a new stove and washing ma-
chine for the parsonage, (these two collap-
sed after about 20 years of service), a new
copier and typewriter for the office, which
are essential to our mission, etc. **But our
real need is for an increase in our regular
giving. Fifty percent of our income comes
from that source. Our projected operating
expenses for 1991 are \$2,430.30 per week.**
This past week, for example, we took in
only \$1,235.29. While some of you will be
away this summer, we need your help to get
through the summer months. Please, if there
is anything you can do to increase your giv-
ing, it will be greatly appreciated.

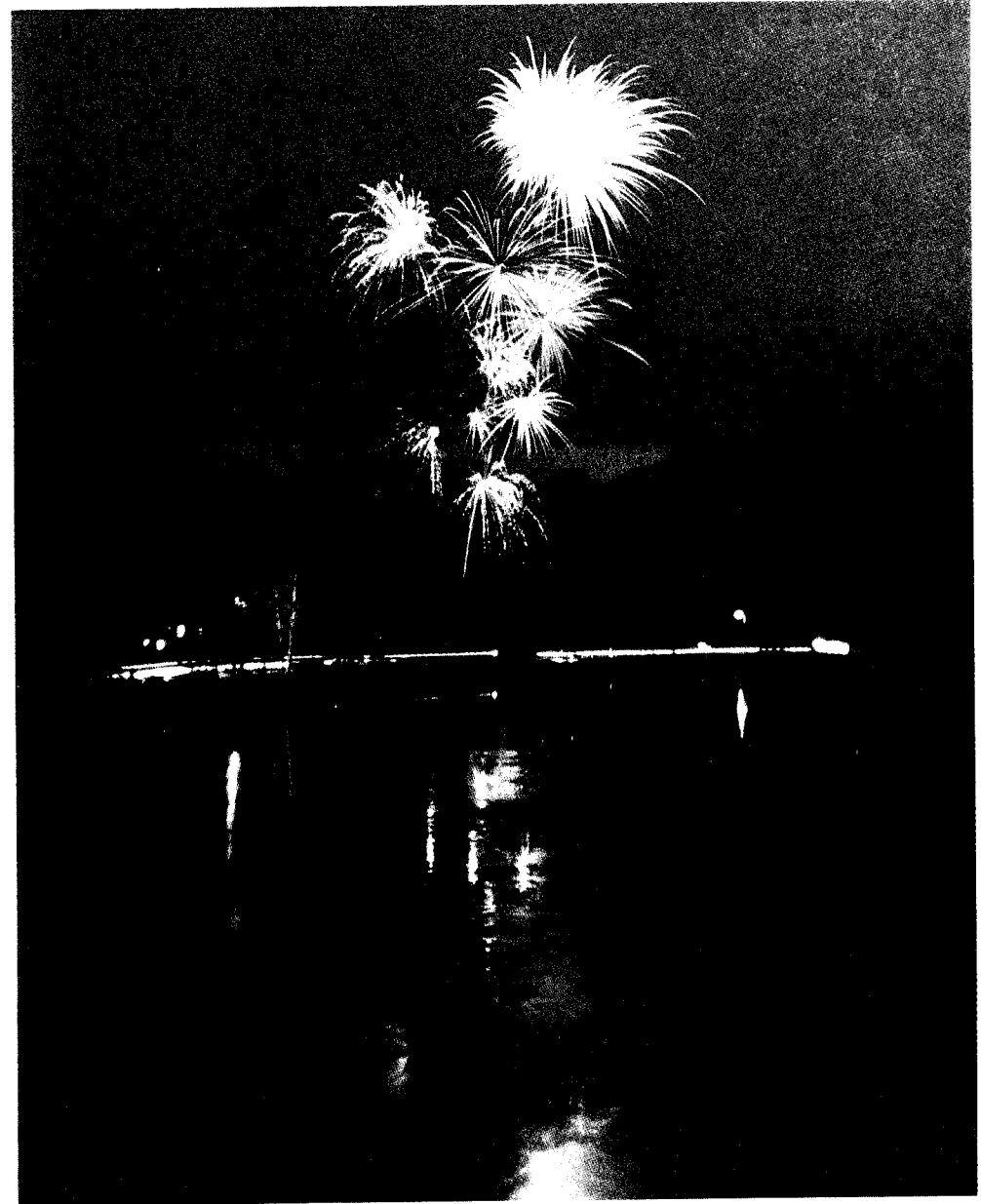

COMMITTEE ON ALCOHOL APPROVES CHANGE IN THE COMMUNION SERVICE - We know that Jesus initiated the Lord's Supper with the use of wine. It was the custom then to use wine at meals and wine to celebrate at the feast of the passover. Wine was used extensively in both the Old and New Testaments. Paul even recommended the use of a little "Wine for the stomach's sake". However, we know today that about ten percent of our nations population are alcoholics. This means that

for some persons drinking alcohol of any kind even to celebrate communion is like taking poison. Therefore, at the July 2, 1991, meeting of the Church Council, your Committee on Alcohol recommended to the Council that each time we celebrate the Lord's Supper, we offer an alternative to those taking communion at this church. This change was approved unanimously. In this way, all members of the church can come to the table of the Lord and be included in His supper. In the center of the communion trays, we have prepared glasses which contain a grape juice alternative which you can request by asking the server. Simply say "Grape Juice" should you prefer that choice. Some persons will do that because they have a problem with alcohol and some because of choice. But all will be served at the table of the Lord.

**COMMITTEE ON ALCOHOL APPROVES CHANGE IN THE
COMMUNION SERVICE** - We know that Jesus ini-
tiated the Lord's Supper with the use of
wine. It was the custom then to use wine at
meals and wine to celebrate at the feast of
the passover. Wine was used extensively in
both the Old and New Testaments. Paul even
recommended the use of a little "Wine for
the stomach's sake". However, we know to-
day that about ten percent of our nations
population are alcoholics. This means that
for some persons drinking alcohol of any
kind even to celebrate communion is like
taking poison. Therefore, at the July 2,
1991, meeting of the Church Council, your
Committee on Alcohol recommended to the
Council that each time we celebrate the
Lord's Supper, we offer an alternative to
those taking communion at this church.

This change was approved unanimously. In
this way, all members of the church can come
to the table of the Lord and be included in

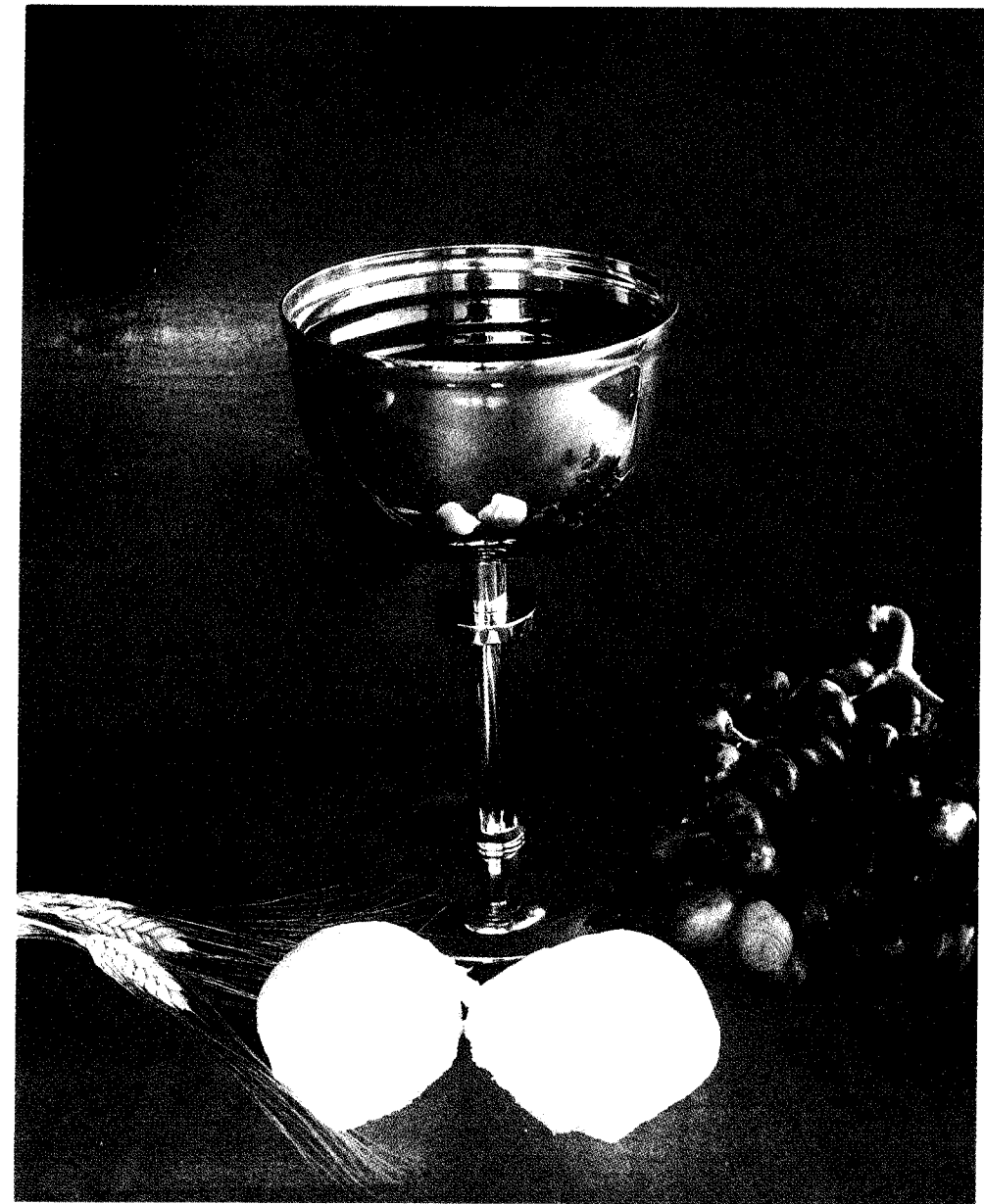

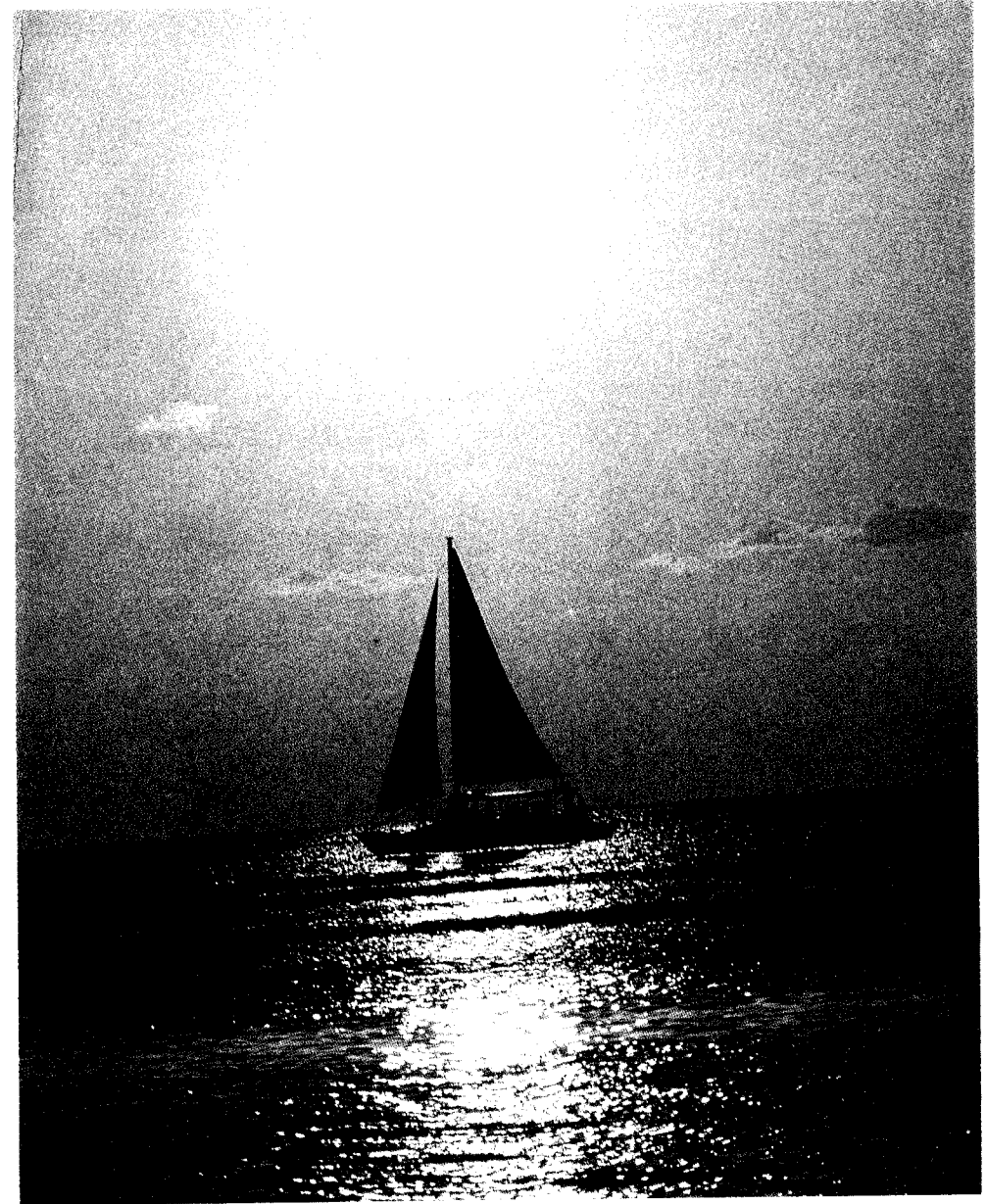

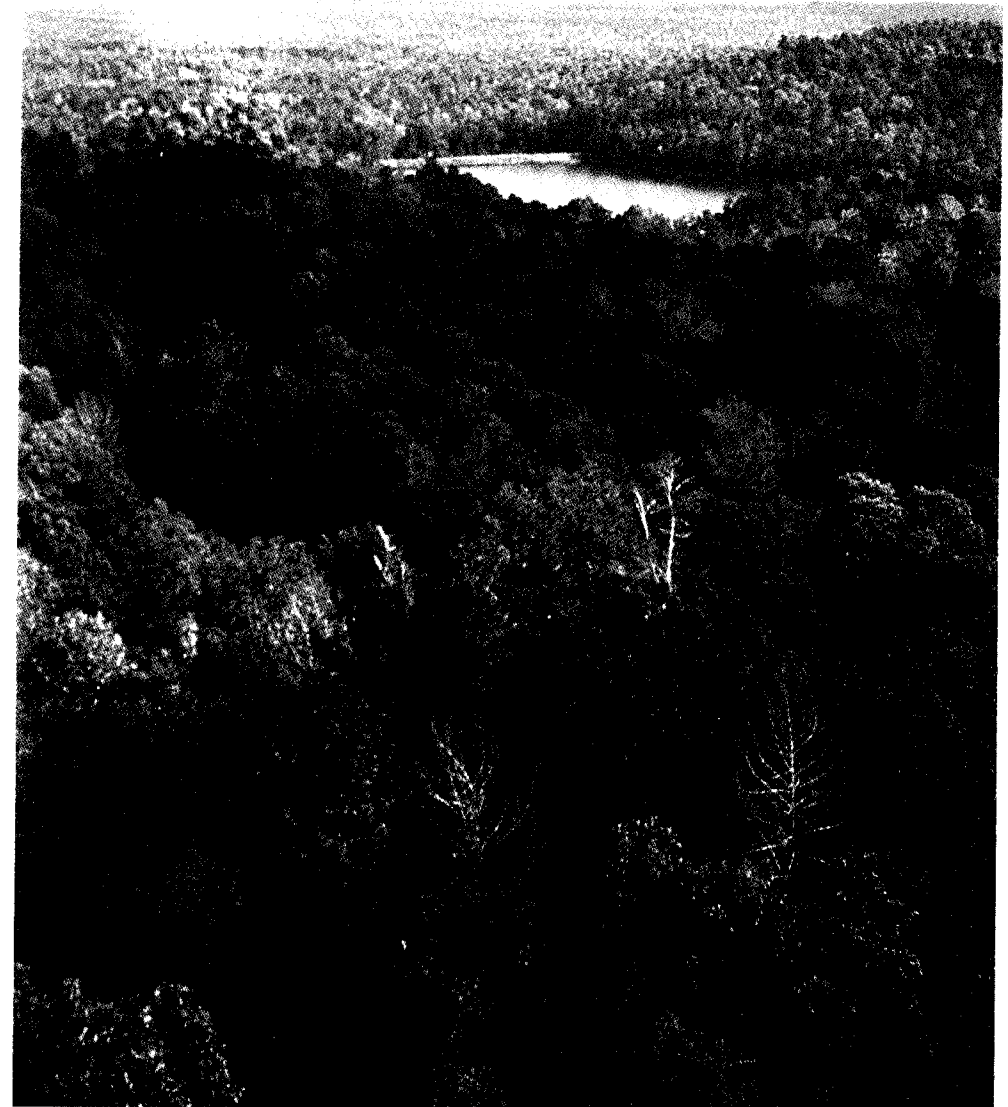

COMMITTEE ON ALCOHOL APPROVES CHANGE IN THE COMMUNION SERVICE - We know that Jesus initiated the Lord's Supper with the use of wine. It was the custom then to use wine at meals and wine to celebrate at the feast of the passover. Wine was used extensively in both the Old and New Testaments. Paul even recommended the use of a little "Wine for the stomach's sake". However, we know today that about ten percent of our nations population are alcoholics. This means that for some persons drinking alcohol of any kind even to celebrate communion is like taking poison. Therefore, at the July 2, 1991, meeting of the Church Council, your Committee on Alcohol recommended to the Council that each time we celebrate the Lord's Supper, we offer an alternative to those taking communion at this church. This change was approved unanimously. In this way, all members of the church can come to the table of the Lord and be included in His supper. In the center of the communion trays, we have prepared glasses which contain a grape juice alternative which you can request by asking the server. Simply say "Grape Juice" should you prefer that choice. Some persons will do that because they have a problem with alcohol and some because of choice. But all will be served at the table of the Lord.

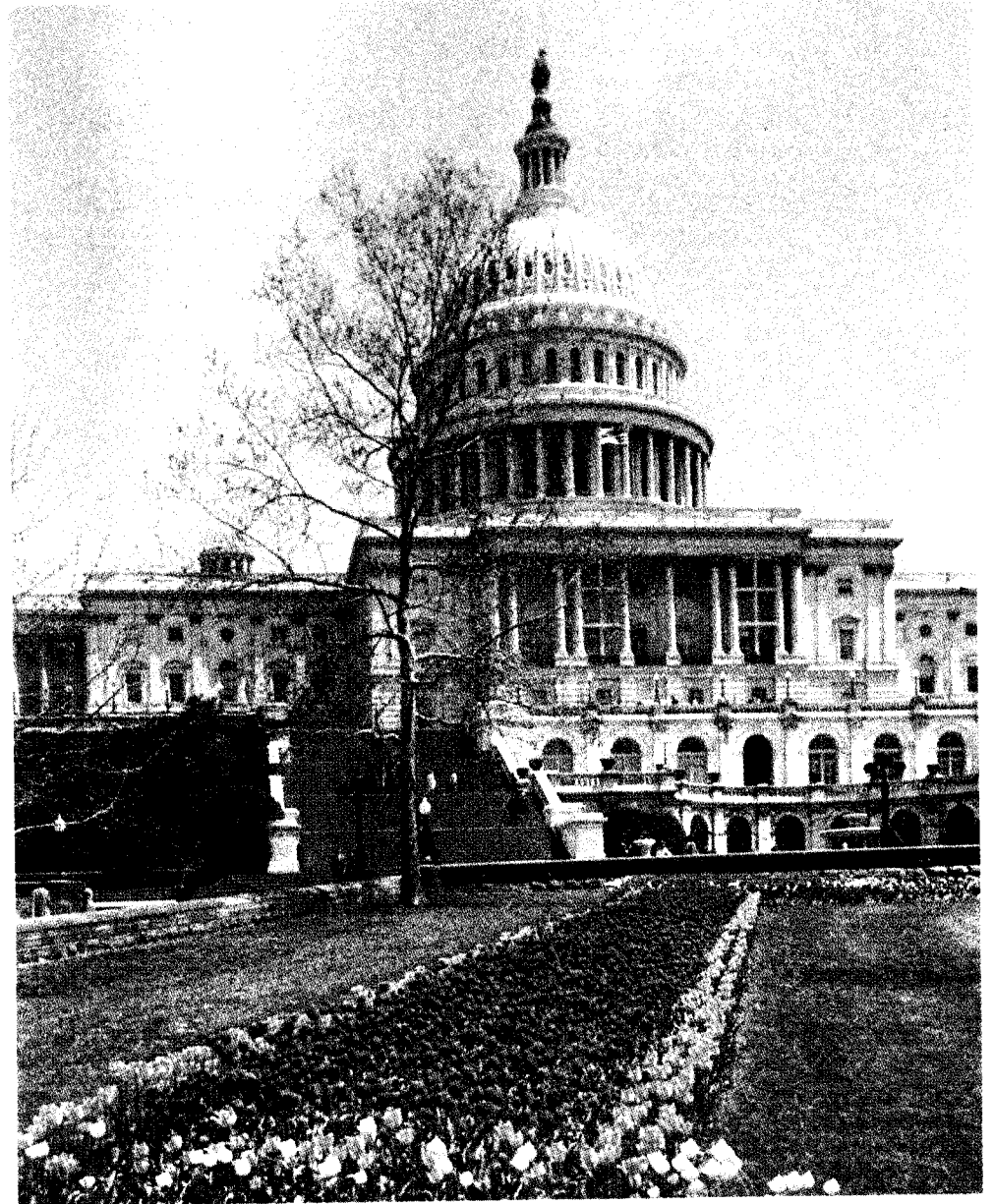

COMMITTEE ON ALCOHOL APPROVES CHANGE IN THE COMMUNION SERVICE - We know that Jesus initiated the Lord's Supper with the use of wine. It was the custom then to use wine at meals and wine to celebrate at the feast of the passover. Wine was used extensively in both the Old and New Testaments. Paul even recommended the use of a little "Wine for the stomach's sake". However, we know today that about ten percent of our nations population are alcoholics. This means that

for some persons drinking alcohol of any kind even to celebrate communion is like taking poison. Therefore, at the July 2, 1991, meeting of the Church Council, your Committee on Alcohol recommended to the Council that each time we celebrate the Lord's Supper, we offer an alternative to those taking communion at this church. This change was approved unanimously. In this way, all members of the church can come to the table of the Lord and be included in His supper. In the center of the communion trays, we have prepared glasses which contain a grape juice alternative which you can request by asking the server. Simply say "Grape Juice" should you prefer that choice. Some persons will do that because they have a problem with alcohol and some because of choice. But all will be served at the table of the Lord.
